

Dear Sir,

I have the honour to report on the Radio Broadcast Receiver of H. H. R. Gresham Esq., which has been tested at the wireless Station during the past three weeks.

<u>Description of Apparatus</u> - The Receiver is of a super-sensitive type employing six Vacuum Tubes and embodying what is technically known as the Neutrodyne Circuit. In addition to removable coils suitable for the usual broadcast wavelengths between 300 and 550 metres, the receiver is supplied with interchangeable coils to allow reception on all wavelengths between 300 and 3000 metres. The equipment includes two pair of Headphones and one loud speaker besides the usual filement and high tension batteries.

Results obtained - Under good atmospheric conditions, the broadcast concerts from Buenos Aires and Monte Video have been received on the loud speaker at the strength of an average gramaphone. The Station at Rio de Janeiro, also other unknown broadcast stations have been heard at sufficient strength for use with the headphones but only under very favourable conditions.

<u>General Observations and Suggestions</u> - To the unskilled, the instrument would at first be found difficult to adjust in order to obtain good results. This complexity of controls is necessary in order to obtain freedom from jamming and sufficient sensitivity for Loud speaker results from the South American Proadcast Stations which use a power of less than 1 K.W. Good results could not be obtained in Stanley from the usual Foolproof Type of instrument generally used for Broadcast reception over short distances in Europe. The selectivity of the Instrument is remarkably good, so much so that, when correctly tuned for the Buenos Aires Broadcast wavelength of 360 metres, vessels working on the usual 600 metres wave in the near vicinity are only heard very weekly. Such being the case, with this Receiver installed in Stanley, it is improbably that any interference would be noticed from the Eastern W/T Station when transmitting on Continuous waves or Spark wavelengths of 1250 or 1600 metres. The 600 metre wave transmissions would quite likely be heard strong, however, this wavelength is now only used occasionally.

2

It is suggested, any Broadcast receiver licensed should only be permitted to use coils for wavelengths between 300 and 550 metres. It would then be unlikely that any interference would be experienced at the Eastern W/T Station during reception owing to the Broadcast Receiver oscillating. It would perhaps be advisable that the set in question be licensed provisionally for use in Stanley to ascertain definitely how it will function on a normal short aerial. The long-wave coils could be returned to the Makers.

If the results proved as anticipated (a) that no interference was experienced at the Eastern W/T Station, (b) That the possibility of interception of Morse traffic was improbable, there would appear to be no objection from the Wireless Station point of view, to such Broadcasting Receivers being licensed for use.



The Wireless Telegraphy Ordinance, 1925. LICENCE to establish a Broadcast Receiving Station.

THE HONOURABLE HENRY HERBERT RUSSELL GRESHAM of Stanley, Falkland Islands, is hereby granted a Licence, subject in all respects to the provisions of the Wireless Telegraphy Ordinance, 1925, and of the Regulations made thereunder, and to the conditions specified herein, to establish and maintain a wireless station for the purpose of receiving messages at Stanley House, Stanley, Falkland Islands.

THIS LICENCE is valid for the period of one year ending on the fifteenth day of April, 1929, and is liable to cancellation at any time by notice in writing from the Colonial Secretary.

A fee of TEN SHILLINGS is payable to the Colonial Treasurer on the grant of this Licence.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. The Licensee shall not use or allow the station to be used for any purpose other than the reception of broadcast wireless messages.

2. Any receiving set and any of the following parts, viz: Amplifiers (value or other) telephone head receivers, loud speakers, and values, used under this Licence must be approved by the Superintendent of Telegraphs and Telephones.

3. The station shall not be used in such a way as to cause interference with the working of other stations. In particular, values must not be connected in such a manner as to be capable of causing the aerial to oscillate.

4. The combined height and length of the external aerial (where one is employed) shall not exceed 100 feet. An aerial which crosses above or is liable to fall upon or be blown on to any overhead power wire or telephone wire must be guarded to the reasonable satisfaction of the owner of the wire concerned.
