R.M.S. DARWIN. - WIRELESS OPERATOR.

We have taken up the question of the necessary qualifications of the Wireless Operator for the new vessel with the Radio Services Department of the G.O.O., and quote their letter, Ref. RB/BZ/47, dated 26th November, 1956, in full :-

"1) You wrote on the 24th October, about the appointment of a Radio Officer for your new vessel "D.R.IL" which is being built in this country.

2) Since your present vessel "FITZROY" is of about 800 gross tons the fitting of radiotelegraphy equipment is purely voluntary and Mr Lyse as the holder of a Special Class Certficate is qualified to act as Radio Officer.

3) The new vessel will, we understand, be of about 1700 gross tons and until it is actually registered in the Falkland Islands, i.e. during the delivery voyage, it will be classified as a United Xxayae Kingdom ship and, consequently, will be subject to the International Convention for Safety of life at Sea. This Convention provides that ships over 1600 tons <u>must</u> be fibted with radio-telegraphy and the radio officer must be the holder of at least a Second Class Certificate.

4) It appears from your letter that the Superintendent of Posts and Telegraphs, Port Stanley, may be satisfied that Mr Lyse's qualifications are such that he may meet the requirements for a Second Class Certificate to be issued to him. It would, of course, be for the Superintendent to decide, probably by examination, whether or not he will issue such a certificate.

5) When the "Darwin" sails from this country we shall require the Radio Officer to be a second Class Certificate holder to meet the Safety Convention requirements. It is possible that between now an and April 1957 Mr Lyse could qualify for the issue of a Second Class Certificate by the Falkland Islands Administration, in Which case our requirements would be met. "

You will see that unless the Director of Posts and Telegraphs at Port Stanley feels that Lyse's qualifications enable him to grant a Second Class Certificate, we will have to obtain a new Radio Operator, at least for the voyage out.

We feel that Lyse has all the necessary practical knowledge required, and if it was possible for the Director of Posts and Telegraphs to examine him in Stanley and grant the necessary certificate, we feel that this would be more satisfactory that attempting to obtain the certificate in this country, as no doubt an examination set in familiar surroundings would give Lyse more self-confidence and increase his chances of **SURCESS** passing.

Would you therefore approach Mr Mercer on Lyse's behalf and arrange the necessary examination if at all possible. You will appreciate that we would naturally prefer to retain Lyse's services on the new vessel in view of his long experience of the Falkland Islands conditions, and trust that this will be possible.
