#### NEW HEADQUARTERS FOR THE UNIVERSAL POSTAL UNION.

A new headquarters for the Universal Postal Union is being erected in Berne. In accordance with normal practice it is proposed to furnish the new building to a large extent by gifts from member countries.

- 2. The International Bureau would like the United Kingdom to donate furniture and fittings for the Library. The G.P.O. have agreed in principle. The cost of fitting out the Library in the manner envisaged by the International Bureau will be approximately 43,710 Swiss Francs or £4,400. This figure is made up of 38,910 Swiss Francs (£3,900) for shelving and 4,800 Swiss Francs (£480) for desks and chairs.
- 3. It has been suggested that the Overseas Dependent Territories might give the desks and chairs (leaving the United Kingdom Member to donate the shelving). The cost to each Territory would be about £21.
- 4. I should be grateful to learn whether you agree to this suggestion. A telegraphic reply would be appreciated.

PLEASE ALSO ALLY THIS QUESTION TO SOUTH GEORGIA.
