Dear Sir, Tenclose a copy of a letter from myself to the Superintendent of Telepaphs, dated 13 th. May 1942. I have been to see Mr. Mercer today and he informs me that he put my letter before the Naval authorities at the Wireless Station but could obtain no salis faction. Mr. Mercer agrees that if I were to make representations to you some improvement in the Service might be found possible. The situation since May 1942 has become worse nistead of better and you will find, on enguing, that it is the exception rather than the rule for any telegram handed in at Stanley Loday to be delivered on the West Falkland before tomorrow. at the present time the scheduled hours of work between Stanley, Fox Bay, PortSamuelos and Pebble are 7. 45 a.m. & 12.30 pm local time. It is obvious therefore that no telegram handed in after 12.30 p.m can be received on the West before 7.45a.m the following day. It is however, not so clear to me why letegrams handed in at & Cauley between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon cannot be hansmitted to their destinations at the 12.30 p.m. schedule. This is very rarely done. 7.7.0

Is this delay due to the Censon's hows of altendance at the Telegraph office not fitting in with the Telegraph office hours of work?

In common with other Westers I would very much appearate any improvement in the Service that you find it possible to effect.

Dear Sir,

I am writing to ask if there is any hope of the two daily schedules of work between VPC VQZ & PEB being altered to more convenient times. They are at present 7.0 a.m. & 12.30 p.m. local mean time. This means that any telegram handed in at either end after 12.30 p.m. cannot be delivered before 7.0 a.m. the next morning and more probably much later still.

The schedules which formerly proved to be most convenient for ourselves, and I should imagine VQZ too, were 9 or 9.30 a.m. and any time between 3 & 4.30 p.m. If $V^{\circ}C$ keeps constant watch on 600 metres, would such a change of time inconvenience them at all ?
