In reply to your letter of the 25th of April, 1932, I am directed to inform you that there is no objection on the part of this Government to the importation by you of several pairs of silver foxes from the United Kingdom for the purpose of breeding the species in captivity on the property of Bluff Cove Station.

2. I am to add that it is understood that the foxes will be imported in a healthy condition, will be securely impounded, and will be permitted in no case to cause hurt or damage to the property of others or to the natural life of the Colony.
