I find that the new fence at Hookers Point needs extending at the Northerly end about 80 yards into the bay, as at very low tides, animals can get round the end of the stone wall.

This fence would have to be made of crates and rails, as it is under water for a good part of the time.

I consider that this should be done if possible by the next Spring Tide, as there is a large area of Tussac planted now, and stock getting in at present could do a great deal of damage to the young plants. Also four posts are needed on the stone wall to help support the fence on it

In regard to the continuation of the new fence at Hookers Point, the Colonial Engineer informs me that the Gate and rail fence will prove very costly, as there is not sufficient stone near to fill the crates and it would have to be boated. As an alternative he suggests that a wire fence be run from the new gate to the old wireless fence at the Common boundary. This fence would be about 300 yards long and would cost approximately the same as the Gate and Rail fence, <sup>was estimated</sup> viz £365. It would also allow an open roadway from the Common to the peninsula.

There is also 100 yards of additional fencing required at the East end of the new fence, owing to the fact that the heavy Easterly winds have filled in the bay on the East side of Hookers Point since the new fence has been erected. This will take the fence to deep water and will prevent any sheep straying into the Tussac plantation.
