

My Lord,

I have the honour to inform Your Lordship that a pair of Aing Penguins have been discovered at Yorke Bay in Port William about five miles from Stanley, and in view of the rare occurrence of these fine birds in the Falkland Islands I have thought the matter of sufficient interest to bring specially to Your Lordship's notice. I trust that I do not err on the side of optimism in expressing the hope that the species may make a permanent habitat in the Colony and start to breed.

2. I enclose copies of coloured photographs of the Ring Penguins which have been taken by Mr. G. Roberts, Colonial Engineer.
