Sir,

I am directed by the Governor to inform you that there are at Stanley certain whale specimens which Mr.

J. E. Hamilton of the 'Discovery' Expedition has suggested the British Museum might care to possess.

These were collected at the same time as the whale specimens sent to the Museum some years ago. They comprise (1) the skull and lower jaw-bones of a male sperm whale which was about 54 feet long and (2) the skull and lower jaw-bones of a southern right whale which was about 50 feet long. Both specimens are tolerably clean.

2. In the event of your desiring these specimens forwarded, I am to request you will telegraph when arrangements will be made for their shipment by one of the home-going whaling factories in March or April. All expenses in connection with the handling and shipment of the specimens will as in the case of the last specimens be charged as an advance for recovery from the British Museum through the Crown Agents for the Colonies.
