YOUR telegram No. 6 of 22nd February:
Whale oil.

I see no reason for a discrimination in
favour of Chilean companies.

There is a large stock of oil at Valparaiso
for which there is no sale, and trade is
practically paralysed.

Consequently enforcement of prohibition
would scarcely affect Chilean companies.
