Sir,

Some months age Mesers Salvesen & Company sent in an account for £91.10.0 for hime of wheir S.S. "Hanka", and at your request I referred the same back to them asking whether they could see their way to making some reduction.

Vriting on June 7th last they inform us that they had carefully noted all that we had said and had gone into the matter, but had come to the conclusion that their Manager really had not charged enough as he had not taken all risks into consideration. In order not to complicate matters they sent anaccount for the came figure as their Manager had rendered, and they conclude the letter as follows:~

- " We must therefore to our regret ask you to be good
- " enough to collect from the Government the full
- " amount of our account, namely 291.10.0 and place
- " the same to our oredit".

We are sorry that Messus Salvesen and Company felt unable to meet your washes, but have no option but to communicate their reply asking for the full amount of the account.
