EXTRACT FROM COLONIAL OFFICE DESPATCH No. 85 of the 20th of July, 1920.

3. I should explain that the last paragraph of the letter from the Department of Overseas Trade was written under a misapprehension, but I understand that the Department is willing to advise the Grown Agents as to the arrangement of the sales of any consignments sent to this country by the Government for disposal. Such consignments should, therefore, be made to the Grown Agents, who have now been requested to deal with them in consultation with the Department of Overseas Trade. You will no doubt ensure that the skins are carefully indentified. MINUTE.

To The Honographe Colonial Secretary From The Government Naturalist. 23.d August 1923.

I have the honour to state that I have headed over to the Falkland Islands Company 7 barrels containing 127 Fur Seal Skins for transmission to the Grown Abents.

With reference to your letter No. 607/23 of the 24th August 1923, regarding seven barrels containing 127 fur seal skins shipped to us per s.s. "LAGARTO" for sale, I have the honour to state that at the suggestion of the Department of Overseas Trade, the sale of this consignment was placed in the hands of Messrs C.M. Lampson and Company, I now enclose for your information, a copy of the firm's valuation report and assortment list, together with a copy of their account sales in respect of the disposal of 107 skins. The proceeds, amounting to £62. 18.'8. will be found credited in our account for April.

2. The valuation of 10s/-d approximately per skin was not considered attractive, but, having regard to the report on the condition of the skins and the unsatisfactory state of the market, it was decided, with Mr Middleton's concurrence, to dispose of them at the first auction at the best price obtainable.

3. At Mr Middleton's request twenty skins have been retained and are being prepared for exhibition /the
