H.M.C.S. Afterglow on the 19<sup>th</sup>

Oct 19<sup>th</sup> 8.10<sup>PM</sup> I went on board Afterglow and the cook  
came and asked me to go and have a look at a man  
down in the crews quarters. I went down and  
seen T Rawson who appeared to be asleep. I tried to  
waken him but there appeared to be no life in him.  
I then sent for the doctor & Chief of Police. Chief of Police  
came and had a look at Rawson felt his pulse and  
seemed to think that Rawson was dead.

Doctor arrived & handed Rawson over to him and the  
Doctor reported that he was dead. It being then 8.25<sup>PM</sup>
