

*Dear Arthur,*

On 19th October, 1951, I sent to Colonial Governors a memorandum about Honours procedure. That memorandum has now been brought up to date and I enclose a revised version. It contains a fair number of amendments, the most important of which are those relating to

- (a) the decision to make substantive awards instead of honorary awards to certain categories of British protected persons: and to
- (b) the increase in the annual quota of awards available to the Colonial Office.

When I wrote in 1951 I said that it had been found in practice more satisfactory to consider recommendations for C.M.G.s and C.B.E.s as one group. My reason for mentioning this specially is that on occasions some Governors have given their recommendations separately with a stated order of preference for each group. This has sometimes proved inconvenient and unless a Governor definitely wishes a candidate to be considered for one Order and not the other it would be helpful if all recommendations for "C's" could be placed in one group with a single order of preference.

I also referred in my earlier letter to the position of Indians who are resident in the United Kingdom and Colonies and I promised to send further advice when the position had been clarified. There have been no developments since that date, and the procedure for dealing with the award of Honours to Indians remains very much the same. This is set out in paragraph (A) (6) of the memorandum.

Two other points are worth mention. First I wish to draw attention to the possibility of making greater use of the British Empire Medal for the award of which few Governors submit recommendations. I do not suggest any lowering of standards, as any recommendation not measuring up to the requirements of the Honours and Awards Committee (see paragraph (B) (3) of the memorandum) would certainly be unsuccessful, but I hope that you will keep this point in mind when sending in your half yearly lists. Secondly, an increase in the number of awards for political services is to be expected as territories advance towards self-government. It will generally be found desirable for a Governor to have informal consultations with the Prime Minister, Premier or Chief Minister as the case may be, in territories where these offices exist, when it is desired to make an award for political services, but, while Ministerial views would be taken into consideration, the Governor is not, of course, bound to accept them. The timing of awards for political services may also need care, and as a rule it may be inexpedient to make such an award shortly before elections are to take place.
