I would add that the ceremony of presentation took place at 12 noon on Sunday, the 9th of September, 1928, in Stanley on the Green situated to the west side of the precincts of Christ Church Cathedral divine service in which had been attended previously by Dr. Reford myself and by detachments under their respective officers

these units drew up on the green so as to form two
sides of a hollow square while the two remaining sides

I inspected the parade, and then read out the Sovereign's Warrant before handing it to Mr. Reford around
whose neck also I hung the Badge.
