NEWS ITEM

At 11.10 a.m. on 8th December 1961 His Excellency presented the Insignia to Mr. William John Grierson. Mr. Grierson, as will be remembered, was appointed to be a Member of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire on the Queen's Birthday 1961.

Immediately afterwards His Excellency presented to Mr. Charles Desmond Keenleyside a Testimonial on Vellum awarded by the Royal Humane Society for his gallantry on the 14th June 1960 when a motor car had plunged off the East Jetty trapping two of the passengers. It was dark and the temperature of the water was 43 degrees but Mr. Keenleyside was in the water for 33 minutes until he had succeeded in bringing both the trapped persons to shore though in both cases life was extinct.

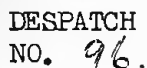



I have the honour to inform you that the following announcement appeared recently in the Press in the United Kingdom:-

"The Queen having approved, a Service of the Order of the British Empire is to be held at 2.30 p.m. on Wednesday, 30th October in St. Paul's Cathedral. H.R.H. Prince Philip Duke of Edinburgh hopes to be present as Grand Master of the Order. Altar Silver and a Cope of the Order will be dedicated at this Service.

Those belonging to the Order and holders of the British Empire Medal who are desirous of attending this Service are invited to apply for a ticket to "The Registrar of the Order of the British Empire", 8 Buckingham Gate, London, S.W.1. The closing date for applications is 31st August, 1963. If the demand for tickets exceeds the allotted number of seats available, it will be necessary to hold a ballot. Applicants for tickets are requested to state full name and the Class of appointment which they hold in the Order, viz. KBE, CBE, OBE or MBE, or whether they hold the Medal of the Order. Letters customarily shown after the name denoting other Orders, Decorations or Medals should be stated."

2. I should be grateful if a similar announcement could be made locally so that anybody who holds an appointment in the Order of the British Empire and who may be in this country at the end of October, may apply for a ticket if he or she wishes to do so.

3. This circular is despatched to all High Commissioners, Governors, Resident Commissioners, Administrators, the British Resident, Zanzibar, and the British Commissioner and Consul, Tonga. It is also sent to the United Kingdom Commissioner, Singapore, for the information of the Government of the State of Singapore, and to the United Kingdom Commissioner, Malta, for the information of the Government of the State of Malta. It is copied to the Colonial Attaché, Washington, and to all British Information Officers for information.
