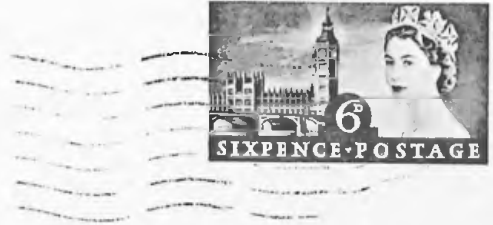

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your Despatch No. 106 dated the 30th October, with which was forwarded the Polar Medal awarded in December, 1963, to Captain William Johnston for his good services as Master of the R.R.S. "John Biscoe" from 1950 to 1961.

Captain Johnston arrived in his ship at Port Stanley on 19th November. He had, unfortunately, been taken seriously ill during the voyage and was admitted to hospital on his arrival here. In view of his serious condition it was decided that advantage should be taken of the fact that the R.R.S. "Shackleton" was sailing for Punta Arenas on 26th November to send Captain Johnston to London for medical treatment. It was therefore not possible to arrange for the more usual type of ceremony at Government House for the presentation of this award. I therefore decided to present the Polar Medal to Captain Johnston on board the R.R.S. "Shackleton" shortly before the ship sailed on the 26th November, and this was duly done at a short ceremony at which were present the senior officers of the Falkland Islands Government and the British Antarctic Survey, the Captain of R.R.S. Protector and some of Captain Johnston's friends now resident in Stanley.



This instruction applies equally to their wives. Medals for life saving are exempted from this ruling.

In the unlikely event of an officer learning that it is proposed to confer a foreign decoration on him, he should at once report the matter through the usual channels, so that it can be brought to the notice of the Governor, Administrator, or Resident Commissioner, as the case may be.
