

I have the honour to refer to the circular telegram of the 26th of April, 1938, and previous correspondence, regarding the presentation to Government Houses in the Colonial Dependencies, of printed portraits of Their Majerties in their Coronation robes, in commemoration of the access on of Their Majesties to the Throne.

- 2. During the Mar, for various reasons, progress with the original printings was much delayed and, at His Majesty's request, the question was raised whether, in view of the then existing circumstances and also of the expense which would be subsequently involved, it might be desirable to cancel the original plan and to substitute photogravure engravings for the small painted copies. I am inclined to support this view particularly as I have since learned that it may be upwards of twenty-five years before the small painted copies are likely to be available.
- 3. Engravings of both portraits have now been made and signed artist's proofs are available for immediate distribution. These engravings, which measure 30 inches by 20 inches, (59 inches by 27 inches to the edge of the mount) unframed, are printed in sepia and, I understand, are excellent reproductions of the original paintings. Moreover Their Majorties have graciously intimated their willingness to autograph the copies sent to Government Houses. In the circumstances I should be glad to learn whether you would be prepared to accept engravings in place of the small painted copies.
- 4. I understand that, in addition to the engrerings, it is the intention that coloured printed reproductions of the original printings of the same size a the engrerings are also to be made, but that copies are not likely to be available for at least a year. You may feel, however, that engrerings would be more dignified and more suitable for Government Houses than coloured prints.
- 5. Should you no heatre there will be no objection to your leaving a final decision in this matter until you, or one of your senior officers, have had an opportunity, whilst on leave in this country, of seeing the specimens of the engravings and coloured prints. In this event you will no doubt inform me pecordingly.
- 6. I would add that a number of Governors who have recently been on leave in this country have intimated that they would be willing to recept engravings.







STATE PORTRAIT OF HER MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II.

I have the honour to inform you that arrangements are being considered for the presentation of copies of the State portrait of Her Majesty The Queen for use in Government Houses and by certain other persons in Colonial territories, and it has been suggested that the presentation should take the form either (a) of a reproduction by a new method which entails throwing a photographic image on to a primed canvas which is then painted by an artist of proved merit, or (b) of a colour print by improved methods which give a very satisfactory result.

2. The sizes in which it is proposed to produce the portrait are as follows:-

Process (a) Full size 96 x 60 inches
Three-quarter
size 84 x 52½ "
Half size 68 x 42½ "

Process (b) 28 x 22½ "

Works particulars of the sizes of the portraits which will be required in the various territories, and to say which type will be acceptable. Although, as you will appreciate, it will be necessary for me to use a certain amount of discretion in dealing with this matter, which is being considered here on a general basis affecting also Foreign Office and Commonwealth Relations Office posts abroad and Government Houses in the Commonwealth countries, it would greatly assist me if I could be given some idea of your preferences. It should be understood that it may not be possible for the larger sizes to be presented in every case, and the hope has been expressed by the authorities concerned that the requests for these will be kept as low as possible. It has further been suggested that the type of portrait indicated at (b) above which costs very much less would be suitable in some instances. In these circumstances, even if

your preference may be for one of the larger sizes, I shall be glad to know whether as an alternative a smaller size or a portrait produced by process (b) would be acceptable.

- 4. In a few territories a slightly wider distribution of the portrait may be desired, and in particular the question of making presentations to the Queen of Tonga, the Sultan of Zanzibar, the Rulers in the Federation of Malaya and in Brunei, the Resident Adviser at Mukalla, the Administrators of the Windward and Leeward Islands, the Virgin Islands, the Turks and Caicos Islands, the Cayman Islands and the Western Pacific Islands High Commission territories, including the New Hebrides, and the British Agent at Tonga will require consideration, and I should be glad of the views of the Governors and High Commissioners concerned. For such persons the coloured prints should certainly be adequate. The question of providing portraits for the Commissioner-General, South East Asia, and for the Governors of the three Regions of Nigeria will also need to be considered.
- 5. A final decision as to the numbers of copies of the portrait to be produced by the two processes has not yet been made and the purpose of this despatch is to obtain a preliminary estimate of the numbers of copies likely to be required. I should be glad to receive an early reply.
- 6. This circular has been addressed to all Colonies, Protectorates and Regional Organisations except Tonga. It has been sent to the High Commissioner for the Federation of Malaya under cover of a separate despatch.

STATE PORTRAITS OF THE LATE KING GEORGE VI AND QUEEN ELIZABETH THE QUEEN MOTHER

I have the honour to refer to my circular despatch No. 835 of the 7th September, 1954, regarding the provision of copies of the State Portrait of Her Majesty The Queen and to inform you that consideration has also been given to the possible production and presentation of coloured copies of the State Portraits of the late King George VI and Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother.

- 2. Most Colonial territories are already in possession of the signed engravings of the State portraits of the last reign which were procured on their behalf by the Crown Agents for Oversea Governments and Administrations as the result of the replies to Mr. Creech Jones' circular despatch of the 24th December, 1946. Certain Governors, however, expressed a wish at the time to wait until painted copies of these portraits became available. It has now been suggested that the State portraits of the late King George VI and The Queen Mother might be reproduced by the same methods as those which are being adopted for the portrait of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. If it is finally decided to do this it may well be desired in those territories where there are no copies of portraits of the last reign, to be provided with copies; and in other territories it may be desired to have copies of the portraits produced by the new process to replace existing engravings.
- 3. I shall be glad to be informed as soon as possible of your wishes in the matter in order that they may as far as possible be taken into account by the responsible authorities.

My dear Arow.

At various times in his travels it has occurred to the Secretary of State that it is illogical and unsatisfactory, and indeed invidious, that Embassies and other United Kingdom establishments abroad should be sumptuously furnished and maintained by the Ministry of Works at the expense of Her Majesty's Government, whereas the furnishing and upkeep of Colonial Government Houses depend on local Legislatures and local revenues, and sometimes, in the more politically advanced territories, on the whims of local Ministers.

I personally have long held the view that it would be much better if Her Majesty's Government were to be responsible for assessing and paying Governors' emoluments, and for equipping and maintaining their houses. (This, of course, is what happens when a Colonial territory achieves independence and the Governor is replaced by a United Kingdom High Commissioner). The Secretary of State was interested in this view but he agrees that, whether or not it is widely shared, there can be no question of suggesting such a revolutionary change at this time. He has, however, taken up afresh the question of supplying suitable pictures to Government Houses, and has discussed this with the present Minister of Works.

It will be recalled that in 1952 Mr. Lyttelton (as he then was) sent a despatch (circular 1172/52 of the 6th December, 1952) to Governors about the possibilities of getting pictures on loan from this country for Government Houses. If you turn up the despatch you will see that Mr. Lyttelton mentioned two possible ways in which it then appeared that such loans might be made.

One was by amending the legislation then in force so as to enable pictures to be lent from the National collections - i.e. the National and Tate Galleries. The legislation has been amended, but it does not look as if anything very helpful can be expected from those collections. Apart from other considerations, the Trustees of the Galleries are very reluctant to let pictures leave this country.

The second way which was open in 1952 was for Colonial Government Houses to draw on the collection of pictures and other works of art which the then Minister of Works (now Sir David Eccles) was forming - by means of a private fund. Some Governors did take advantage of this offer although the majority, for one reason or another, did not wish to do so. Nevertheless the initiative taken by Sir David Eccles resulted in the creation of a valuable collection of pictures and other works of art which were sent to United Kingdom Government buildings both at home and &broad as

well as a few Government Houses. This particular collection has now been entirely distributed and there is no money left in the Fund, but the way in which it was formed was an encouraging example and precedent.

Since 1952, and despite the opportunity offered by the Eccles collection, Governors have from time to time asked about the possibility of obtaining pictures from this country, and the Secretary of State is most anxious to be helpful in this matter. He feels, as I am sure we all do, that the provision of good pictures from this country should be encouraged in every possible way, and he is very keen to overcome the various difficulties which make the supply difficult. Some of the difficulties - as the example the danger of deterioration in some climates - are perhaps incapable of solution by even the best intentioned Colonial Secretary or Department. I know, too that some Government Houses are already well supplied with suitable pictures and some have comparatively little wall space.

The Secretary of State realises that in many cases it is not easy for Governors to get money voted for purchasing pictures from this country for their residences, or even for the cost of packing and freight on loaned pictures. He has it in mind personally to launch an appeal for funds from which pictures could be purchased in cases where the necessary provision cannot be made locally. (Some people might wish to give, or lend, pictures instead of subscribing money).

Whether the cost were to be met by the local Government, or the pictures were to be paid for from the new Fund, if created, the Minister of Works, Mr. Molson, has readily and generously agreed that use may be made of the services of his Ministry. These consist of an Advisory Panel, whose membership includes officers of the National and Tate Galleries and other connoisseurs, and the "Curator of Pictures" who is constantly on the lookout for appropriate pictures for United Kingdom establishments at home and abroad. If use were made of these services for Colonial Government Houses suitable purchases would be made - at the discretion of the experts or in accordance with special preferences indicated - and Governors visiting this country could make a selection from the pictures quoted.

Before deciding whether to launch an appeal, the Secretary of State would naturally wish to know whether and to what extent use is likely to be made of the resulting fund. The purpose of this letter therefore is to ask you whether you would be likely to wish to make use of the services of the Ministry of Works which I have briefly described; and, if so, whether the cost of any pictures would in your case be met from local funds or whether you would wish them to be purchased from the Fund if established. (Another possibility is that your Government might be prepared to contribute to the Appeal Fund).

I have mentioned only pictures, but I think that the Secretary of State has an idea that the purpose of the Fund might later be extended to other things - such as plate.

Thank you for your letter GIN. 168/169/01 of the 28th January about pictures for Government There are no pictures in this house belonging to Government other than Royal portraits and eight hanting prints, but we are well supplied, for we have our own pictures with us. On the other hand. I think another Covernor might well be arrious to take advantage of pictures to be paid for from the new Fund, if it is created. I om afroid there would be no hope of my Legislative Council agreeing to pay for pictures or contribute to the Appeal Fund.

Should the purpose of the Fund later he extended to other things, whatever a Covernor might require would have to be virtually undernacable and unbreakable to survive at the hands of his local staff!
