

BOUND FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Various spellings of names are recorded as written at the time.

William Henry BOUND was born circa 1848 in Pill, North Somerset, England to **William Henry** and ? **BOUND**

William came to the Falkland Islands on board the *Allen Gardiner*.

William, age 25 and a mariner living in Stanley, was married to **Margaret Fanny GOSS**, age 17 and living in Stanley, 24 December 1873 in the Parish Church according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church after Banns by H C Lory Act Col Chaplain. The witnesses were James C Dettleff and F I King, jnr. William's father was recorded as William Henry Bound, pilot, and Margaret's father was recorded as Jacob Napoleon Goss, storekeeper.

William had Pill House on Davis Street built and named it after his place of birth.

In April 1888 William was the manager of the Ship Hotel and requested permission for Lee WHITMAN to manage the hotel during his absence from the Falkland Islands. [H42; 195]

William, Margaret and Emily departed for England on board the *Osiris* 14 December 1896.

By June 1908 William was recorded as a publican in England.

FIRST GENERATION:

Children of William and Margaret BOUND:

1. **Mary Margaret Ann BOUND** born 23 September 1874 in Stanley and baptised 16 May 1875 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as mariner. Mary was married to **Henry John "Harry" PETALUGA** 21 October 1896 in the house of Mrs W Bonner by the Tabernacle. Henry died 27 February 1925 and is buried in Grave J828. Mary died 20 November 1961 and is buried in Grave O1707.



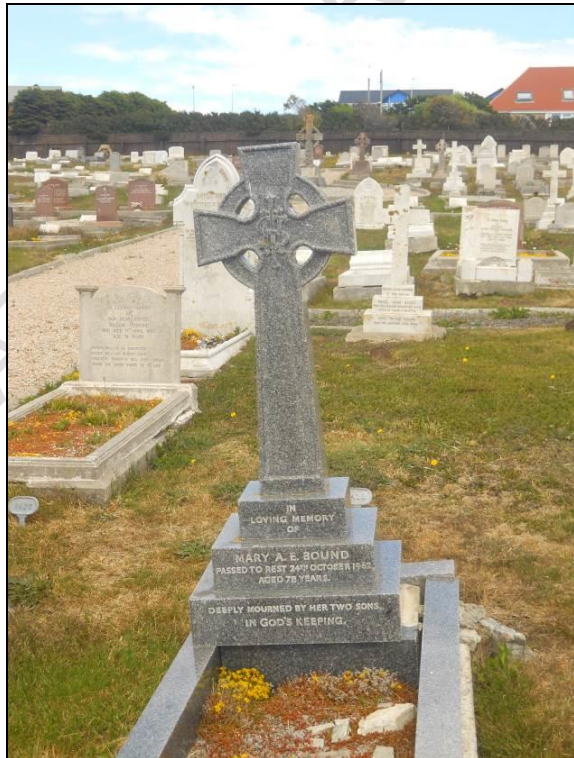

2. **William Henry BOUND** born 30 November 1875 in Stanley and baptised 23 February 1876 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as seaman. William, age 22, died 26 August 1898 from syphilitis and gastric ulcer and was buried 30 August 1898 in Grave D324.
3. **Richard Napoleon BOUND** born 24 October 1877 in Stanley and baptised 24 February 1878 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as seaman. Richard departed for Liverpool on board the *Oropesa* 16 May 1911, arriving back 15 November 1911 on board the *Oropesa*. Richard, a manager, was married to **Mary Anne Elizabeth "Tom" HUTCHINSON** 19 September 1916 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Edwin Henry Bound and Gladys Mildred Davis. Mary's father was recorded as Robert Hutchinson, deceased mariner, and Richard's father was recorded as William Henry Bound, mariner. Richard was the manager on Saunders Island in the 1920s. Richard, age 64, died Thursday 26 March

1942 at his home in Stanley and was buried 29 March 1942 in Grave O1212. [Obituary FI Weekly News 2 April 1942] Mary travelled to Uruguay in 1944 for medical treatment. Mary, age 78, died 24 October 1962 in Stanley and was buried 26 October 1962 in Grave O1725.

4. **Emily Jane BOUND** born 20 February 1879 in Stanley and baptised 23 March 1879 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as seaman. Emily was appointed a junior school teacher by the Governor 1 March 1894 on an annual salary of £30-0-0. Emily was married to (1) **Henry OTZEN** 2 February 1897 in Bristol, England. Emily and her two children arrived from Liverpool on board the *Orita* 14 January 1908. Emily, a widow, was married to (2) **William BERNTSEN**, hotel proprietor at Sandy Point, 6 June 1908 in the house of Lars Berntsen, Stanley by C Rome Hall, Assistant Cathedral Chaplain. The witnesses were Richard Napoleon Bound and Ann Elizabeth Martin. William's father was recorded as Lars Berntsen, sail maker and Emily's father was recorded as William Bound, a publican in England. Emily was living at Rincon Grande in 1913. William died 13 April 1946 and is buried in Grave P1320. Emily died 12 June 1954 and is buried in Grave Q1537.
5. **Edwin Henry BOUND** born 21 July 1880 in Stanley and baptised 3 October 1880 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as publican. In 1899 Edwin was

thrown from his horse at Teal Inlet and kicked in the head and back. [FIM May 1899] Edwin, age 21 and a shepherd living in Stanley, was married to **Sophia Mary DAVIS** (*first cousin*), age 18 and a domestic servant living in Stanley 21 May 1902 in the house of Mr C Wang according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by me N Blount MA Assistant Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Alice Maud Davis and Charles Wang. Edwin's father was recorded as William Henry Bound and Sophia's father was recorded as John Davis. Edwin was appointed a police constable 1 February 1909 on an annual salary of £72-0-0 and a house. In 1916 his annual salary increased to £84-0-0 and he also received a fuel allowance. Edwin, Sophia and their son Cyril departed for the UK 22 September 1919 on board the ss *Falkland* intending to continue to Australia. Edwin was absent from the Falkland Islands from 22 September to 31 December 1919. The family arrived back from Liverpool on board the *Orita* 19 August 1920. In 1920 Edwin's annual salary was increased to £120-0-0 and he received a house, fuel and uniform allowance. Edwin was appointed foreman of works and timekeeper 1 January 1922. Edwin, age 43 and a foreman of works, departed for the UK via Montevideo 19 April 1924 on board the *Roald Amundsen* with his wife and son Cyril, age 15, so that his wife and son could reside in England for the benefit of Cyril's education. Edwin and Cyril arrived back in the Falkland Islands 15 October 1928 on board the *Orita*. Due to the office of foreman of works and timekeeper being made redundant and with Edwin having over 20 years of loyal service he was granted early retirement on pension. Edwin wrote to the Colonial Secretary on 19 February 1930 requesting that his son was released from prison so that he could take him to England to his sorrowing mother. Edwin and Cyril departed 30 April 1930 on board the *Orita* bound for the United Kingdom. [GOV/CIP/3#06] In January 1938 Sophia was living at The Nook, Highfields, Caldecote, Cambs. Edwin died in the United Kingdom 23 September 1952.

6. **Earle Stanley BOUND** born 1 November 1883 and baptised 3 February 1884 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as publican. Stanley departed for England 7 August 1896 on board the *Neko*. In December 1919 Stanley was on the Roll of Honour.

SECOND GENERATION:

Children of Mary (1) and Henry PETALUGA:

1. **Earl Stanley Bound PITALUGA** born 6 June 1898. Earl, a farmer, was married to **Gertrude Greta HOWARD** (*not in the Falkland Islands*) before 1926, a schoolteacher born in Cambridge. Earl died 13 March 1940 from heart failure and is buried in Grave N1161.

2. **Arthur Bailey Bound PITALUGA** born 3 February 1902 at Rincon Grande. Arthur, a farm manager, was married to **Edith Mary DENT** (*not in the Falkland Islands*) before 1925. Edith was born 18 June 1899 in Derby, England. Arthur died from chronic alcohol poisoning 27 September 1944 and is buried in Grave 1284. Edith died 13 June 1966 at Stanley, age 66, and is buried in Grave T2052.



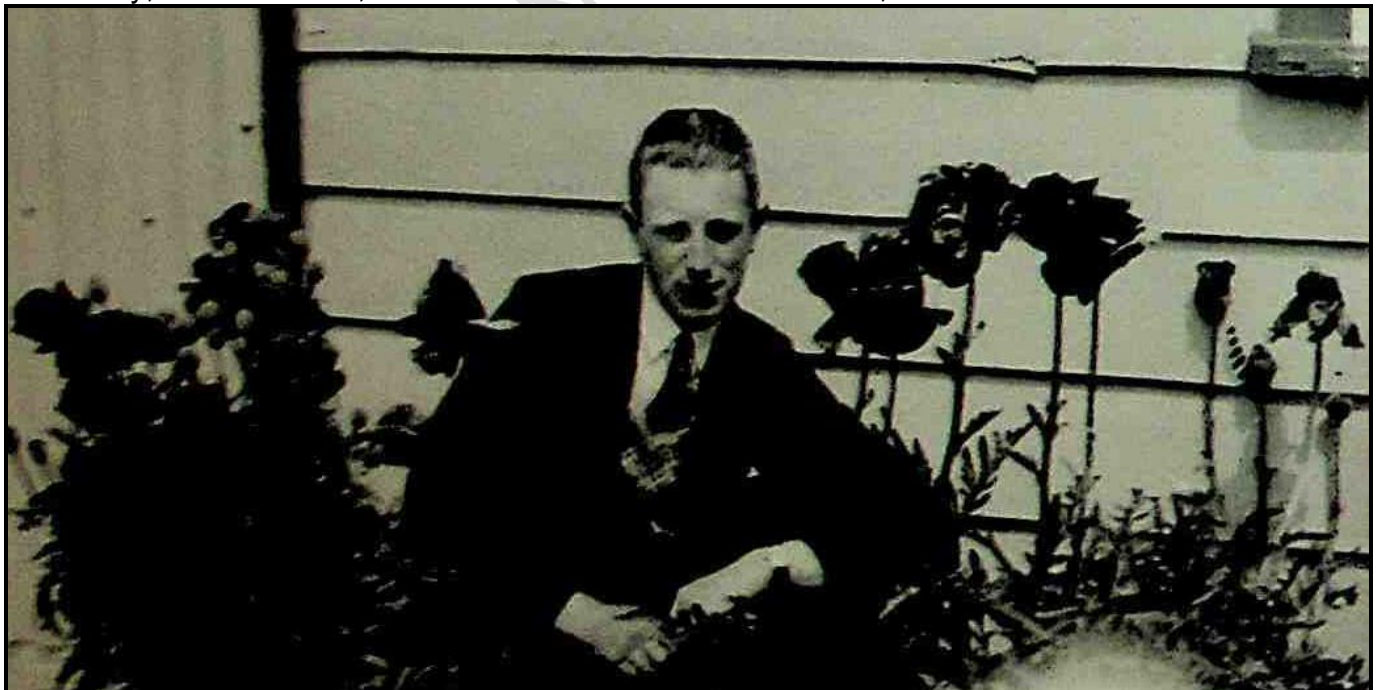

3. **Malvina Jane Bound PITALUGA** born 10 December 1905 in Stanley. Malvina was married to **David Murray GALLOWAY**, an engineer born in Singapore, 16 August 1927 in Edinburgh, Scotland. David was the only son of Sir David Galloway who was living in Singapore at the time of their marriage [FIM November 1927]. Malvina and David both left the Falkland Islands 21 April 1927 on the *Ortega* for Liverpool. They returned at some point after this and then emigrated to the UK in 1930. In 1936 Malvina was the first Falkland Islands woman to become a qualified aviator. Malvina and her three children arrived in Stanley 22 December 1947 on board the *Fitzroy* from Montevideo. Malvina was invited to luncheon at Government House on Race Day 26 December 1947. Malvina and her three children departed Stanley for Rincon Grande 2 January 1948 and returned 9 January 1948 on board the *Fitzroy*. Malvina and her three children arrived in Stanley from Rincon Grande on Sunday 14 March 1948 on board the *Lafonia*. Malvina and her three children left Stanley 16 March 1948 bound for South Africa via Montevideo.



Children of Richard (3) and Mary BOUND:

1. **Henry John Lennard "John" BOUND** born 20 December 1917 in Stanley and baptised 27 January 1918 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as farmer. Henry, age 25 and a civil servant, travelled to Montevideo in 1943 for health reasons. Henry, a civil servant, travelled overseas on leave in 1954, 1966 and 1972.

2. **Horace Leslie "Nap" BOUND** born 7 October 1919 in Stanley and baptised 2 November 1919 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as farmer. Horace, a clerk in the Colonial Treasury, was married to **Joan BIGGS**, clerk in the Colonial

Treasury, 3 February 1951 at Christ Church Cathedral by M Floyd Jones BA, Clerk. The witnesses were M J Field and J Bound. Horace's father was recorded as Richard Napoleon Bound, deceased boarding house proprietor, and Joan's father was recorded as Hubert Arthur Biggs, caretaker. Horace, age 64, died in 1985 in England. [In the Dictionary of Falklands Biography available online] Joan, age 84, died 28 April 2013 and was buried in Grave W3560.

Children of Emily (4) and Henry OTZEN:

1. **Gerhard William OTZEN** born circa 1899 in Hamburg, Germany. Gerhard was living at Rincon Grande in 1913. According to the Pat Brit site Gerhard was adopted by an uncle in South Africa after his father's death.
2. **Max OTZEN** born circa 1900 in Hamburg, Germany. Max was living at Rincon Grande in 1913. According to the Pat Brit site Max was adopted by an uncle in South Africa after his father's death.
3. **Stanley OTZEN** born 30 October 1903 in Uhlenhorst, Hamburg, Germany. Stanley was living at Rincon Grande in 1913. Stanley was married to **Agnes CRIGHTON** (*not in the Falkland Islands*).
4. **Anna Ada OTZEN** born 10 September 1905 in Hamburg, Germany. Anna was living at Rincon Grande in 1913. Ada, under 21, was married to **Rowland William CARTER**, chief inspector of stock, 22 April 1926 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by M Craigie-Halkett, Registrar General. The witnesses were E M Pitaluga and H C Ley. Rowland's father was recorded as Samuel Carter, deceased, and Ada's father was

recorded as Henry Otzen, deceased. Ada and Rowland were divorced in 1940. Ada was buried 9 January 1990 in Patagonia. Anna arrived from Punta Arenas 19 January 1925 on the *Ballena*. She returned to Punta Arenas 26 March 1925 on board the *Lagarto*. Anna, age 22, departed 1 February 1928 for Punta Arenas on board the *Orduna* to visit friends.

Children of Edwin (5) and Sophia BOUND:

1. **Cyril Lionel Edwin BOUND** born 9 June 1908 in Stanley and baptised 2 August 1908 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. In 1929 Cyril was in prison, as he had been sentenced to two years hard labour, and his father and Alice STEVENSEN applied for permission to visit him. [DEF/POL/2#16] On 25 May 1929 Cyril was admitted to hospital suffering from acute congestion of the bases of both lungs and secondary cardiac failure. The gaol matron had called the doctor as Cyril was feverish. [DEF/POL/2#17] Cyril's father wrote to the Colonial Secretary on 19 February 1930 requesting that his son was released from prison so that he could take him to England to his sorrowing mother. Cyril and his father departed 30 April 1930 on board the *Orita* bound for the United Kingdom. [GOV/CIP/3#06]
2. **Gwendoline Evelyn Mary BOUND** born 23 June 1911 and baptised 2 August 1911 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as police constable. Gwendoline, age 2 years and 1 months, died 24 July 1913 from aprenonas, general debility and cardiac failure and was buried 27 July 1913 in Grave I 762.
