

FUGELLIE FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Any variations which may occur in the spellings of names are recorded as written in the records at the time.

Otto Konrad FUGELLIE was born circa 1864 in Stavanger, Norway to **Peter John FUGELLIE** and ?,

Otto, age 21 and a mariner from Stavanger, Norway living in Stanley, was married to **Mary Ann MARTIN**, age 19 and living in Stanley, 9 September 1885 in the Parish Church according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Thomas Martin and Louisa Martin. Otto's father was recorded as Peter John Fugellie, ship owner and Mary's father was recorded as William Henry Martin, blacksmith assistant.

On 7 April 1896, 3 days after his marriage to his third wife, William Martin conveyed to Otto Fugellie, for the price of one shilling, quarter of an acre fronting on Davis Street being part of Crown Grant 225. William Martin still owned the remaining western half acre part of Crown Grant 225 bounded on the north by Davis Street and the west by Dean Street.

Otto bought 32 shares in the *Result* from Andrew Bell 11 March 1893. The remaining shares were held by Thomas Rowell, a watchmaker (28 shares), and Andrew Bell, camp manager (4 shares). The *Result* was built in Aldeburgh, Suffolk in 1866. She was registered anew from London 17 June 1890 under a certificate of sale dated 20 June 1889 as No 1 of 1890 in Stanley, Falkland Islands with a registered tonnage of 54.08.

Otto was master of the *Result* when she entered Stanley 25 October 1894 with a crew of four from San Julien bound for Fox Bay with a cargo of horses. On 1 April 1895 he was the master of the *Result* when she entered with a crew of 5 in ballast. The *Result* left for West Falkland 20 June 1897 and had to shelter in Port Harriet on the 21st due to a gale. On the afternoon of the 23rd she began to drag and struck the reef off Goose Green about 9pm and was eventually abandoned. [FIM July 1897]

Captain Fugellie left for Sandy Point, Chile, via San Carlos on board the ss *Biene* as a passenger 24 August 1897. On 13 September 1897 Mrs Fugellie and family followed on board the ss *Herodot*.

On the 27 September 1898 Otto Fugellie appointed Andrew Baillon, the Colonial Manager of the Falkland Islands Company Ltd his attorney to sell his land fronting onto Davis Street and on the 4 July 1899 the land was sold for £29.

Mary died in Punta Arenas 4 March 1919 and was buried in the Municipal Cemetery 6 March 1919.

Otto, age 63 and a mariner from Chile, died 16 September 1926 in Gull Harbour, West Falkland and was buried by Dr John Craddock in the last vacant plot in Weddell Cemetery at midday covered with the Chilean flag. He was recorded as a Norwegian and a naturalised Chilean. The Chilean Ministry of Foreign Affairs was informed of his death by the Chilean Consul in Stanley on 20 September 1926 and they advised that they had published his death in the press of Santiago press for the knowledge of his family. Shipping Records

Otto was recorded as the master of the following vessels in the Falkland Islands Government Shipping Records after moving to Chile:

Albatross, a 201 ton Chilean vessel registered in Punta Arenas, Chile and with a crew of 14 when she entered Stanley 13 April 1899 from Punta Arenas with a cargo of livestock. She left for Douglas Station on the 14th. According to the Church Magazine of April 1899 she was alleged to have struck the *Hornet* at 2am on the morning of Saturday 15 April 1899. According to the Church Magazine of July 1899 the *Albatross* arrived at San Carlos N on 29 April and commenced loading 1340 sheep, finishing loading at 5pm. She also took in 70 tons of water and left early on the 29th for Camarones Bay, Patagonia.

Colomba Maria, a 73 ton Chilean vessel which entered Fox Bay with cargo from Punta Arenas 22 May 1909 and cleared for Punta Arenas 1 June 1909.

Dove previously known as the *Don Louis*, a 128 ton Chilean vessel with ten crew, from Quellou, Chile arrived 18 October 1912.

Dove from Chile arrived 18 December 1912 bound for South Orkneys, whaling.

Emma arrived 30 March 1925 from Fox Bay and Port Howard with cargo and passengers.

Morven arrived 8 June 1925 leaving for Salvador and Weddell with cargo.

Morven arrived 22 October 1925 in ballast, leaving 27 October 1925 for Hill Cove and Pebble with cargo and passengers.

Morven arrived 5 May 1926 from Darwin with cargo and passengers, leaving 8 May for Saunders, Hill Cove, etc with cargo.

Morven arrived 26 May 1926 from Weddell Island with cargo, leaving 27 May 1926 for Saunders Island & Pebble Island, etc

Morven arrived 16 June 1926 from Saunders and Speedwell Islands with cargo & passengers, leaving 18 June 1926 for Salvador, etc with cargo.

Morven arrived 5 July 1926 from Salvador ports with cargo & passengers, leaving 9 July 1926 for Weddell Island with passengers and cargo.

FIRST GENERATION:

Children of Otto and Mary FUGELLIE:

1. **Peter William FUGELLIE** born 2 September 1886 in Stanley and baptised 26 September 1886 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as seaman.
2. **Mary Ellen "Ellen" FUGELLIE** born 18 June 1888 in Stanley and baptised 22 July 1888 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Mary, age 16, was married to **Sigurd NIELSEN**, age 26 and a sailor, captain, 10 June 1905 in the house of Otto Fugellie, Punta Arenas according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Church of England by Edwin Coupland Aspinall. The witnesses were Ernest Swinhoe and Mary Ann Martin. Sigurd's father was recorded as Anton Nielsen, sailor, captain and Mary's father was recorded as Otto Fugellie, sailor, captain.
3. **Otto Konrade FUGELLIE** born 30 July 1890 and baptised **Otto Conrad FUGELLIE** 16 February 1891 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as mariner.
4. **Gustavus Adolphus FUGELLIE** born 21 October 1891 and baptised **Gustav Adolph FUGELLIE** 15 February 1892 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as master of the *Chance*. Married Isabella ? (*not in Falkland Islands*).
5. **Alexander Emile FUGELLIE** born 10 March 1894 in Stanley and baptised 15 March 1894 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as mariner. Alexander left for Punta Arenas, Chile on board the ss *Antartico* 12 June 1919.

6. **Eric Theodore FUGELLIE** born 15 May 1896 and baptised 9 August 1896 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as mariner.

SECOND GENERATION:

Children of Ellen (2) and Sigurd NIELSEN:

1. **Harold Leslie NIELSEN** born 19 July 1906 (*not in Falkland Islands*) and baptised in the Chaplaincy of Punta Arenas 29 January 1907. The family were living in Punta Arenas at the time and his father's occupation was recorded as mariner. The godparents were Otto Fugellie, Mrs Fugellie and Harold Nielsen.
2. **Ellen Malvina NIELSEN** born 17 November 1910 (*not in Falkland Islands*) and baptised in the Chaplaincy of Punta Arenas 30 September 1912. The family were living in Ushuaia at the time and her father's occupation was recorded as ship captain.
3. **Sigurd Alexander NIELSEN** born 13 November 1912 (*not in Falkland Islands*) and baptised in the Chaplaincy of Punta Arenas 30 September 1912. The family were living in Ushuaia at the time and his father's occupation was recorded as ship captain.
4. **Gustave Conrad NIELSEN** born 17 September 1914 (*not in Falkland Islands*) and baptised in the Chaplaincy of Punta Arenas 3 August 1916. The family were living in Ushuaia at the time and his father's occupation was recorded as ship captain. The godparents were Peter and Mrs Fugellie.
5. **Peter Johen NIELSEN** born 11 June 1916 (*not in Falkland Islands*) and baptised in the Chaplaincy of Punta Arenas 3 August 1916. The family were living in Ushuaia at the time and his father's occupation was recorded as ship captain. The godparents were Mr and Mrs Fugellie.

Children of Gustave (4) and Isabella FUGELLIE:

1. **Gustav Otto FUGELLIE** born 21 October 1916 (*not in Falkland Islands*) and baptised 21 October 1917 in Punta Arenas. The godparents were Peter Fugellie and Mrs Fugellie. The family were living in Punta Arenas at the time and his father's occupation was recorded as clerk.
2. **Daphne Cristina FUGELLIE** born 11 September 1919 (*not in Falkland Islands*) and baptised 13 June 1920 in Punta Arenas. The sponsors were Joseph Kelman and Cristina Kelman. The family were living in Punta Arenas at the time and her father's occupation was recorded as clerk.
3. **Eric James FUGELLIE** born 2 February 1921 (*not in Falkland Islands*) and baptised 10 February 1922 in Punta Arenas. The sponsors were Otto Fugellie and Bride Fugellie. The family were living in Punta Arenas at the time and her father's occupation was recorded as clerk.
4. **Elena Isabel Maria FUGELLIE** born 29 May 1924 (*not in Falkland Islands*) and baptised 2 December 1929 in Punta Arenas. The family were living in Punta Arenas at the time and her father's occupation was recorded as empleado.
5. **Dorotea Irene FUGELLIE** born circa May 1925 (*not in Falkland Islands – is this their child?*). Buried 9 November 1926 age 18 months in Patagonia, of Magallanes.
