GOOD FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Various spellings of names are recorded as written at the time.

William GOOD was born circa April 1822 at Whitesea, Peterborough, Cambridge, England.

William, age 18 years and 4 months and a labourer, enrolled 28 July 1840 at Queens Square, Middlesex, England. He was a private in the 94th Foot Regiment. His India service was from 13 January 1841 to 15 May 1854

William transferred to the 18th Royal Irish Regiment 1 December 1854 and served 1 year and 8 months. His Crimea service was from 30 December 1854 to 18 July 1856.

William transferred back to the 94th Foot Regiment 1 August 1856; his total service in the 94th was 15 years and 3 months.

William transferred to the Falkland Islands Garrison 1 July 1857. His Falkland Islands service was from 26 October 1857 to 15 April 1864.

William was married to Mary HOGAN née? (not in the Falkland Islands).

William, Mary and their children Mary Ann and James arrived in the Falkland Islands on board the British Barque *Ealing Grove* 12 January 1858 as part of the Falkland Islands Company detachment of Pensioners. Apart from the Commanding Officer, Captain Moloney, the Company consisted of three sergeants, two corporals, a drummer and thirty privates. [H14, pg 316]

William's total military service was 23 years and 10 months, including 6 years and 11 months in the Falkland Islands Garrison. On the 25 May 1864 he was recorded as being 42, of exemplary character and received 5 marks. His other overseas service consisted of 13 years and 4 months in India, 1 year and 7 months in Crimea and 6 years and 6 months in the Falkland Islands. He was discharged due to disbandment of the regiment. William was 5 foot 7 inches tall with brown hair and brown eyes and a fresh complexion. [PRO: WO 117/12] William also received the Crimea War Medal clasp Sebastopol and the Turkish Crimea Medal.

On 6 December 1861 Captain Molony informed Governor Moore that he has recovered the sum of £6 from Private Good on account of the damage done to the Government cottage by his wife, now a prisoner in the gaol. [G18; 98]

William, Mary and James left with Captain Molony and his men on board the transport ship *Velocidade* 23 January 1864.

William was discharged 24 May 1864 at Woolwich and his intended residence was Newry, County Down, Ireland.

William departed 13 April 1867 from Portland, England on the *Norwood*, arriving in Freemantle, Western Australia 13 July 1867 as part of the Enrolled Pensioner Force. He served there until 1874 when he briefly went to New Zealand before arriving in Tasmania the same year. He was in Tasmania from 1874 to 1878.

Children of Mary and John HOGAN:

1. Mary Ann HOGAN born circa 1846 in Ireland. Marianne, age 19 and a single woman from Ireland living in Stanley, was married to George Patterson SMITH, age 24 and a Shepherd from Scotland living in Stanley, 21 January 1863 at Trinity Church Stanley according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Church of England by Governor's Licence by Charles Bull MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Christopher Smith and Sarah Elmer. George's father was recorded as Peter Smith, shepherd. Mary Ann's father was recorded as John Hogan, labourer in one register and John Hogan, soldier in two other registers. Permission was granted for the marriage by Marianne's mother, Mary GOOD. On the 31 July 1865 George bought Crown Grant 34 for £15 being half an acre fronting on the north to Fitzroy Road. On 1 September 1865 he purchased Crown Grant 8 for £165 bounded on the south by Fitzroy Road with buildings. In 1884 he was living at Johnsons Harbour. On 7 April 1887 he went into partnership with Thomas Sharp at Johnsons Harbour Station. George died 20 June 1909 and was buried in Grave Ei708 [Obituary FIM July 1909]. After his death Mary Ann purchased Thomas Sharp's share of the Station for £5,500, free of commission. Mary Ann, age 69, died 3 July 1915 and was buried in Grave Ei792. 'We regret to announce the death of Mrs G P Smith, which took place on May 3rd. The deceased lady, who was highly respected by all our local people, has been invalided for a long while past, but bore her illness with great fortitude. She was owner of Johnson's Harbour Station, which for the last few years has been managed by her sons. The funeral, which was attended by a large number of friends and relations, took place on the 7th and was conducted by Father Migone. [FIM August 1915].

Children of Mary Ann and George SMITH:

- 1. **George Patrick SMITH** born 16 October 1863 at Stanley. Died 17 November 1863 from convulsions (*no burial record*).
- 2. **Mary SMITH** born 17 May 1865 at Stanley. Mary, age 24, was married to **Joseph ROBSON**, age 27 and manager of Stanley, 3 June 1889 in the house of Chas Burnel according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were George Patterson Smith and Edward Robson. Joseph, a sheep farmer died 7 March 1911, age 49, in Stanley from gastroenteritis and is buried in Grave D 733. [Obituary FIM April 1911] Mary died 3 August 1960, age 95, in Stanley and is buried in Grave R1676.
- 3. Wilhelmina SMITH born 14 April 1867 at Port Louis. Wilhelmina, age 21 and living at Johnson's Harbour, was married to William PECK, age 25, 14 August 1888 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Church by Patrick Joseph Diamond. The witnesses were G B Smith and Madeline Biggs. William was working as a general hand at Fitzroy in July 1900 and was a witness to the murder of Charles McLeod by Joseph Jenkins. [FI Magazine Aug 1900] William was appointed a police constable 1 July 1914 on an annual salary of £72-0-0 and a house. In 1916 his annual salary increased to £84-0-0 and by 1917 he received fuel allowance as well as a house. In 1920 his annual salary increased to £120-0-0 and he also received a uniform allowance as well as house and fuel. On 21 February 1920 William also held the office of assistant inspector of stock with an additional annual salary of £18-0-0. William, a stockman, died 21 April 1923 from heart disease and was buried in Grave M887. Wilhelmina died 26 November 1933, age 66, and was buried in Grave M1051.
- 4. George Bennet SMITH born 19 February 1869 at Port Louis. George, a shepherd, was married to Isabella McGILL 10 November 1903 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by George Hurst Ag Registrar General. The witnesses were Walter J Kendal and Margaret Coutts. George's father was recorded as George Patterson Smith, sheep farmer, and Isabella's father was recorded as William McGill, shepherd. Isabel died 18 September 1926 and is buried in Grave J945. George died 26 August 1927 and is buried in Grave N965.
- 5. **Ralph Edmond SMITH** born 19 January 1871 at Port Louis. Ralph died 25 August 1958 at Johnsons Harbour and is buried in Grave N1617.



6. **David Rodger SMITH** born 18 June 1876 at Johnsons Harbour. David, a farmer, was married to **Annie RYAN** 5 May 1926 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Special Licence by Mario Louis Migone, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were Mearon McKay and Madge B Biggs. David's father was recorded as George Patterson Smith, farmer, and Annie's father was recorded as William Henry Ryan, cooper. In May 1926 Davide and Annie went to the UK via Montevideo on holiday. David, age 49 and a sheep farmer, was recorded as being 6' tall with blue eyes and fair hair, and Annie, age 31, was recorded as being 5' 3 ½ " tall with blue eyes and brown hair. They arrived back 3 November 1926 on board the *Oropesa*. Annie, age 37, died 22 March 1932 from pulmonary tuberculosis and is buried in Grave N1030. David died 30 January 1962 at Johnsons Harbour and is buried in Grave N1711.

- 7. Andrew Cameron SMITH born 4 March 1882 at Johnsons Harbour. Andrew, a farmer, was married to Edith Winifred BENDER 29 July 1916 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Governor's Licence by Mario Louis Migone. The witnesses were John F Smith and S M Ussher. Andrew's father was recorded as George P Smith, farmer, and Alice's father was recorded as Christoph P Bender, farmer. Andrew died 6 September 1967 at Stanley and is buried in Grave R1762-5. Edith died 16 December 1983 and is buried in Grave R3007.
- 8. **James Hogan SMITH** born 22 April 1884 (twin). Farmer. Married **Alice Mary Theresa BENDER** (sister of Edith) 2 August 1916 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Banns by Mario Louis Migone. The witnesses were John F Smith, Dorothy Doris Bender and Christoph Bender. James died 11 September 1960 at Stanley and is buried in Grave R1680. Alice died 19 February 1963 at Stanley and is buried in Grave R1733.
- 9. John Frederick SMITH born 22 April 1884 (twin). John, a farmer, was married to (1) Mary Ellen CAREY 3 March 1909 at St Mary's Church, Stanley by Special Licence by Mario Louis Migone. The witnesses were Charles Carey and Matilda Evans. John's father was recorded as George Smith, sheep farmer. Mary died 17 September 1913 age 24 of acute chairhaca and pulmonary tuberculosis and is buried in Grave E765. John was married to (2) Eileen Elizabeth RYAN 1 April 1922 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by

Special Licence by Mario Luis Migone, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were John D McKay and Mearon McKay. Eileen died 15 July 1934 age 32 of pulmonary tuberculosis and is buried in Grave N1067. John, age 54 and a farmer, went to Montevideo for medical attention in 1938. He was recorded as being 5' 6" tall with blue eyes and fair hair. John died 29 October 1946 and is buried in Grave N1412.

- 1. **George Austin ROBSON** born 28 August 1890 at Port Louis and baptised 18 September 1890 by Holy Trinity Church. George, a labourer, died 3 August 1915, age 24, from heart failure and pericarditis at San Carlos South and is buried at Port San Carlos. [Mention FIM Sept 1915]
- 2. **Walter Conrad ROBSON** born 4 September 1892. Walter, a shepherd, died 23 December 1957, age 65, in Stanley and is buried in Grave R1602.
- 3. Mary Agnes ROBSON born 12 January 1895 and baptised 10 September 1895 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Married George Alfred BROWN, Royal Navy, 21 December 1916 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Banns by Mario Louis Migone. The witnesses were Clifford H G Lewthwaite and Roy Robson. George's father was recorded as James Brown, fish porter. Later divorced. Mary departed Stanley 27 March 1920 for Liverpool with her sister Margaret on board the Bombay, a whaler. Returned from Liverpool with her husband 25 December 1920 on board the Orita. Mary died 24 February 1953 from pulmonary tuberculosis and is buried in Grave M 1504.
- 4. Margaret Anna ROBSON born 5 October 1897 at Fitzroy and baptised 11 October 1897 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as sheep farmer. Married (1) Clifford Cyril PARKER, a member of the Royal Navy, 12 December 1916 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Banns by Mario Louis Migone. The witnesses were W Peck and John Rolls. Clifford's father was recorded as Alfred Parker, farmer. Clifford, a first class stoker, travelled to Montevideo by the ss Falkland, en route for the UK, leaving Stanley 22 September 1919. Margaret and her two children, Clifford and Dorothy, departed Stanley 27 March 1920 for Liverpool on board the Bombay, a whaler. Margaret and the children returned to the Falkland Islands from Liverpool 8 July 1921 on board the Oruba. Margaret, divorced and no occupation recorded, married (2) Alexander Stanley ETHERIDGE, labourer, 24 April 1935 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by A R Hoare, Ag Registrar General. The witnesses were Helbert Stanley Hansen and Mary Agnes Brown. Alexander's father was recorded as William Etheridge, deceased mariner. Margaret and Alexander both emigrated to the UK in 1956.
- 5. **Joseph Fitzroy "Roy" ROBSON** born 26 May 1900 at Fitzroy North and baptised 29 September 1900 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Roy, a labourer, died 23 October 1963, age 63, in Stanley and is buried in Grave R1746.
- 6. **Wilhelmina Blanche ROBSON** born 6 February 1903 at Fitzroy North and baptised 14 September 1903 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Married **Glynn JONES**, CFM, REME, 26 October 1943 at St Mary's Catholic Church, Stanley by Special Licence by Hugh F Drumm, RC Priest. The witnesses were Mary Fullerton and Johnathan Boyce Pennington. Glynn's father was recorded as Evan Jones, park keeper. Wilhelmina went to the UK in 1944 to join her husband.
- 7. Edward Andrew ROBSON born 22 July 1905 at Fitzroy North and baptised 14 January 1907 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Farm worker. Married Elspeth Lucy "Lucy" McCULLUM 26 June 1939 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Registrar General's Licence by A R Hoare, Registrar General. The witnesses were Jacob Goss and Annie Eliza Browning. Lucy died 25 March 1976, age 71, in Stanley and is buried in Grave U1869. [No

obituary] Edward, a retired farm worker, died 30 August 1976, age 71, in Stanley and is buried in Grave U1870.

- 8. **Thomas Edmond ROBSON** born 11 January 1908 at Fitzroy North and baptised 19 February 1908 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Thomas, a labourer, died 25 December 1942, age 36, from chronic pulmonary tuberculosis and is buried in Grave M1230. [Obituary FI Weekly News 7 Jan 1943]
- 9. **Malvina Rose ROBSON** born 15 May 1910 and baptised 15 March 1911 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Malvina died 14 May 1912, age 2, from influenza meningitis and is buried in Grave Ei745.

Children of Wilhelmina (3) and William PECK:

- 1. William George Edward PECK born 10 June 1889 at Egg Harbour, Lafonia and baptised William George PECK by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. His father's occupation was recorded as horse breaker. William George Edmond PECK, a shepherd, was married to (1) Hannah (Anna) Violet SHORT 25 April 1912 at San Carlos South by Governor's Special Licence by Edward J Seymour, Dean & Chaplain. The witnesses were Henry Charles Betts and Lilian May Short. William's father was recorded as William Peck, shepherd and Hannah's father was recorded as John Thomas Short, carpenter. Hannah died from an acute intestinal obstruction and post operative myocardial failure from inanition 3 February 1945, age 52, and was buried in Grave O1293. William, a widow and caretaker, was married to (2) Mary "Mollie" McLEOD 5 October 1946 at St Mary's Catholic Church, Stanley by Hugh F Drumm, RC Priest. The witnesses were Desmond Peck and Christina Maud Shedden. William's father was recorded as William Peck, deceased and Mollie's father was recorded as John McLeod, deceased. William, a retired shepherd, died 13 July 1979 in Stanley and was buried 17 July 1979 in Grave R1945. Mollie, a pensioner living in Fitzroy Road East, died 7 March 1995, age 78, and was buried 13 March 1995 in Grave V3227.
- 2. Catherine Beatrice PECK born 8 July 1891 at Egg Harbour, Lafonia and baptised 29 September 1891 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as horse breaker. Catherine was married to James DETTLEFF, labourer, 15 September 1920 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Banns by Mario Luis Migone, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were Ernest Dettleff and Eva Peck. Catherine's father was recorded as William Peck, constable and James' father was recorded as John Dettleff. The family emigrated to the UK in 1948.
- 3. **John Bertram Hogan PECK** born 30 October 1893 at Egg Harbour. His father's occupation was recorded as horse breaker. John, a labourer, was married to **May CURRAN** 24 (27?) November 1921 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Special Licence by Mario Luis Migone, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were James Patrick Peck and Maud Curran. John's father was recorded as William Peck, constable and May's father was recorded as Edward Curran, shepherd. John and May emigrated to the UK in 1949.
- 4. Andrew Roger PECK born 5 April 1896 in Stanley and baptised 5 June 1896 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. His father's occupation was recorded as hotel keeper. Andrew, a labourer, was married to Elizabeth Ada SHORT 26 September 1936 at St Mary's Catholic Church, Stanley by Banns by Hugh Drum, RC Priest. The witnesses were William George Edmond Peck and Mary H C McRae. Andrew's father was recorded as William Peck,

deceased policeman and Elizabeth's father as Jack Short, labourer. Elizabeth emigrated to the UK in 1971. Andrew, a handyman, died 5 July 1977 at Stanley and was buried 8 July 1977 in Grave O1894.

- 5. **Mary Louisa Margaret PECK** born 9 October 1898 in Stanley and baptised 13 November 1898 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as horse breaker. Mary, a domestic servant, emigrated to the UK in 1962.
- 6. Ellen Lavinia Wilhelmina PECK born 9 May 1901 and baptised 11 August 1901 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Ellen was married to (1) Albert Stanley KIDDLE, labourer, 29 May 1923 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Mario Luis Migone, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were Peter Kiddle and Lilian Kiddle. Ellen's father was recorded as William Peck, deceased labourer, and Albert's father was recorded as Albert John Stephen Kiddle, shepherd. Divorced 25 April 1941. Ellen, a divorcee, was married to (2) William JOSEPH, quartermaster on the San Castro, Merchant Marine, 2 May 1941 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by James Erik Hamilton, Registrar General. The witnesses were St Joseph David Arthur Newman and Audrey Ellen Kiddle. Ellen's father was recorded as William Peck, deceased labourer, and William's father was recorded as Eddy Joseph, deceased merchant. The family emigrated to the UK in 1944.
- 7. **Eveline Lily PECK** born 14 August 1902 in Stanley and baptised 15 September 1902 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Married **Philip Edward BUCKLEY**, labourer, 6 September 1926 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Banns by Mario Louis Migone, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were Andrew Roger Peck, Mary Peck and Bertram Hogan Peck. Eveline's father was recorded as William Peck, constable, and Philip's father was recorded as Denis Buckley, mason. Philip and Eveline emigrated to the UK in 1949.
- 8. James Patrick PECK born 29 March 1905. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. James, a labourer, was married to Sarah Ellen McATASNEY 16 February 1929 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Special Licence by Mario Louis Migone, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were J F Harling, Mrs Harling and Mary McAtasney. James' father was recorded as William Peck, deceased, and Sarah's father was recorded as John McAtasney, blacksmith. James, a cook, died 23 July 1953 from coronary thrombosis and was buried 27 July 1953 in Grave M1515. Sarah, age 68 and a widow, died 25 March 1968 in Stanley and was buried 28 March 1968 in Grave R1777.
- 9. Desmond Douglas Bernard PECK born 19 August 1907 in Stanley and baptised 15 September 1907 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Douglas, a labourer, was married to Beatrice Ena DAVIS 25 May 1935 at St Mary's Catholic Church, Stanley by Banns by Hugh Drum, RC Priest. The witnesses were James Patrick Peck and Lena Victoria Davis. Desmond's father was recorded as William Peck, deceased police constable and Beatrice's father was recorded as John Davis, deceased labourer. Desmond, a shop keeper, died 10 July 1988 and was buried 13 July 1988 in Grave R3095. [Biography Dictionary FI, pg 416] Beatrice, age 83 and a widow, died 5 December 1990 and was buried 13 December 1990 in Grave V3149.
- 10. Emerald Amethyst PECK born 12 February 1909 at Port Howard and baptised Emerald Amethyst Mary PECK 4 April 1909 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Emerald was married to Terence J SWINEY, Chief PO, Telegraph Wireless Station, Stanley, 3 November 1942 at St Mary's Catholic Church, Stanley by Hugh F Drumm, RC Priest. The witnesses were James P Peck and Mrs

Beatrice Halliday. Emerald's father was recorded as William Peck, deceased, and Terence's father was recorded as Patrick Swiney, deceased Royal Navy. Emerald died 25 December 1942 from chronic pulmonary tuberculosis and is buried in Grave M1231. Terence went to the UK on Navy business in 1947.

Children of George (4) and Isabella SMITH:

- 1. George Douglas SMITH born 1 April 1905 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as publican. George, a publican, was married to Jessie Maud CLIFTON 22 January 1930 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Banns by Mario Louis Migone, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were Leonard Laurence Reive and Annie Clifton. George died 22 July 1976 at Stanley and is buried in Grave R1875. Jessie died 16 August 1979 in Stanley and is buried in Grave R1876.
- 2. **Hilda Evangeline SMITH** born 27 June 1907 in Stanley. Hilda was married to **Martin William Henry BIGGS**, storekeeper, 12 February 1934 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Banns by Mario Louis. The witnesses were Roy V Biggs and Evelyn Smith. Martin, age 47 and a grocery assistant, and Hilda, age 40, went to South Africa via Montevideo on vacation in 1948. Marting was recorded as being 5' 8 ½ " tall with hazel eyes and black hair, and Hilda was recorded as being 5' 4" tall with blue eyes and brown hair. Martin died 19 April 1965 in Stanley and is buried in Grave R1757. Hilda died 16 November 1990 and is buried in Grave R3148.

3. **Isabel Evelyn SMITH** born 16 February 1913 in Stanley. Evelyn was married to **Darwin ATKINS**, store assistant, 22 February 1934 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Banns by Mario Louis Migone, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were S P Atkins and Iris Lehen. After the wedding Darwin and Isabel left Stanley on board the *Reina del Pacifico* for a 3 month visit to Buenos Aires. [Account of wedding Penguin 24 Feb 1934] Darwin, age 22 and a shop assistant, and Isabel, age 21, wife left the Falkland Islands in March 1936 for England. Darwin was recorded as being 5' 9" tall with blue eyes and fair hair and Isabel was recorded as being 5' 5 ½" tall with blue eyes and fair hair. They left England 21 August 1936 for Darwin to take up an appointment in Nigeria. [Penguin 21 Aug 1936]

1. Roma Endora SMITH born 6 March 1917 at Johnsons Harbour. Roma, a nurse, was married to (1) Gordon Edward McGILL, shepherd, 30 December 1942 at St Mary's Catholic Church, Stanley by Special Licence by Hugh F Drumm, RC Priest. The witnesses were Albert Hills and Lilian Alma Dettleff. Romad, age 34, travelled to Montevideo to visit her husband in 1950. She was recorded as being 5' 3" tall with brown eyes and red hair. Gordon died 13 November 1950 age 44 of myocardial failure and is buried in Grave 1438. Married (2) Ernest REIVE, station hand at Green Patch, 28 September 1960 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Church, Stanley by James Ireland, Rt Rev Monsignor, Prefect Apolostic. The witnesses were S H Johnson and Thora Perry. Ernest died 21 October 1994 and is buried in Grave V3218.

2. **Iola Winifred SMITH** born 3 December 1918 in Stanley. Iola was married to (1) **Leslie Holland SOLLIS**, shepherd, 29 August 1944 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by J E Hamilton, Registrar General. The witnesses were Maud Sollis and E J Brain. Leslie died 28 May 1964 at Port Louis and is buried in Grave P1751.
