

GOODWIN FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Various spellings of names are recorded as written at the time.

On 1 April 1874 £10 was made by London Office to Thomas Goodwin, Kirkconnel, Dumfriesshire, Scotland from his sons. [FIC/D3; 316]

Children of Thomas and ? GOODWIN:

1. **John GOODWIN** was born circa 1841 in Dumfries, Scotland. John, age 25, left Cardiff 27 August 1866 on board the *West*. He was brought to the Falkland Islands by the Falkland Islands Company Limited and was paid £3-15-0 a month. [H22] On 24 June 1869 Frederick Cobb, colonial manager of the Falkland Islands Co Ltd, wrote to his London Office and described John as being in some respects the best shepherd in the Falklands. [FIC/D2; pg 261] When John finished working for the FIC in July 1870 he was earning £5-8-4 a month. John was married to **Janet COPELAND/COUPLAND** 29 November 1870 in Durrissdeer, Dumfries, Scotland. John, a shepherd, was re-engaged by the Falkland Islands Company Ltd to proceed by the *Chislehurst*, leaving London December 1870. The *Chislehurst*, a 352 ton British barque under Captain Thomas Bryson, arrived in Stanley 2 February 1871 with cargo, 15 crew and 33 passengers, 15 of whom were immigrants. The trip took 43 days. John was accompanied by his wife Janet. [FIC C1, desp 413, 414; Shipping Registers] On 14 February 1873 the Acting Colonial Manager of the Falkland Islands Company Ltd requested that £5 was remitted free of expense to Thomas Goodwin, Tower Hill, Sanquhar, Dumfriesshire, Scotland from his son John. [FIC/D3; 105] In 1898 John was a partner in Hummock Island with Jacob Daniels and George Halliday. [FIM Dec 1898] Mr and Mrs J Goodwin departed for Liverpool on board the *Oropesa* 17 April 1912. John Goodwin arrived in Stanley from Liverpool 8 December 1919 on board the *Orcoma*. John, age 84 and a British labourer, died 24 November 1925 and was buried at Roy Cove.

2. **Thomas GOODWIN** was born circa 1846 in Dumfries, Scotland. On 24 June 1869 Frederick Cobb, colonial manager of the Falkland Islands Co Ltd, wrote to his London Office requesting that Thomas Goodwin, of Tower Hill, Sanquhar, Dumfries and brother of John Goodwin be sent out by the next opportunity and encouraged to bring out a good working sheepdog. [FIC/D2; pg 261] Thomas, a shepherd from Dumfries, Scotland, was a passenger on board the *Victoria Tatham*, leaving London December 1869. Thomas started work for the Falkland Islands Company Limited 23 February 1870. By 14 October 1870 Thomas was living at Mount Pleasant and earning £3-15-0 a month. [FIC C1, desp 397; FIC D2, p 650; Shipping Registers] Thomas, age 30 and a shepherd, was re-engaged by the Falkland Islands Company Ltd to proceed by the *Guardiana*, leaving Southampton, England 25 September 1876 and arrived in Stanley 8 November 1877. [FIC C1, desp 506; H22; D18, p 52; Shipping Registers] Thomas, a shepherd at Bluff Cove, was married to **Sarah McLEAN**, living in Stanley, 24 February 1887 in the house of Mr Thomas Sharpe according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Fred J Hardy and Mary Jane Sharp. Thomas' father was recorded as Thomas Goodwin, shepherd and Sarah's father was recorded as James McLean, traveller. Thomas was originally to marry Sarah's sister Elizabeth but she changed her mind so Sarah went out to the Falkland Islands instead. Thomas, Sarah and their family returned to Dumfries, Scotland in 1903, leaving Stanley 7 January 1903 on the *Orellana* bound for Liverpool. [Peoples Friend; FIM Feb 1903] Sarah died 1 December 1905 at Carroll Bank, Greenbrae, Dumfries, Scotland. [Obituary FIM Feb 1906]

FIRST GENERATION:

Children of John (1) and Janet GOODWIN:

1. **Thomas GOODWIN** born 5 November 1871 at Fitzroy and baptised 22 November 1871 at Darwin by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Thomas, age 22 and a shepherd living at Hill Cove, was married to **Emily Susan LYES**, age 17 and living in Stanley, 2 August 1894 in the house of John J Halliday according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were J Jardon Halliday and Susan E Halliday. Thomas' father was recorded as John Goodwin, shepherd and Emily's father was recorded as Obadiah Lyes, marine. [Account of wedding FIM Sep 1894] Thomas, a shepherd at Fox Bay, died 15 May 1939 in KEMH, Stanley from stomach cancer and was buried 19 May 1939 in Grave K1134. Thomas left all of his estate equally to his daughter Harriet and his granddaughters Bessie and Linda Kivell. [Reg Off Vol X, pg 33]
2. **Elizabeth GOODWIN** born 5 February 1873 at Hill Side, Fitzroy River. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Elizabeth, age 16 and living in Stanley, was married to **Peter CHAMOSA (LLAMOSA)**, age 27 and a gaucho living in Stanley, 1 May 1889 in the house of Dennis Buckley according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Michael Dettleff and Elsie Kiddle. Elizabeth's father was recorded as John Goodwin, shepherd, and Peter's father was recorded as Joseph Chamosa, sheep farmer. Elizabeth died 6 February 1926, age 53, from cancer of the uterus and was buried 9 February 1926 in Grave J934. Peter died 1 September 1944, age 82, and was buried 3 September 1944 in Grave J1281.
3. **George GOODWIN** born 20 September 1874 at Hillside. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. George was living at Hill Cove 14 September 1900 when he lent £100 to Charles C Wesel at 10% per annum. [Reg Off Vol IV, pg 346] George, a shepherd living in Stanley, was married to (1) **Alice Maria Hannah Mary Jane PAICE** 23 March 1904 at Christ Church Cathedral, Stanley by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Nathaniel Paice and Emily Jane Goss Paice. George's father was recorded as John Goodwin, shepherd and Alice's father was recorded as Nathaniel Paice, shepherd. George and Alice departed for Canada on board the *Oruba* 29 March 1904. [Account of wedding FIM Apr 1904] Alice died 5 November 1905, age 26, at 392 Magnus Avenue, Winnipeg, Canada. [FIM Jan 1906] George arrived back in Stanley 21 November 1906 on board the *Ortega*. George, a shepherd, was married to (2) **Sarah Annie "Annie" FOWLER**, 27 October 1910 at the house of Mr Waddup by J Meredith Bate, Assistant Cathedral Chaplain. The witnesses were Annie Maria Waddup and John F Summers. George's father was recorded as John Goodwin, shepherd and Sarah's father was recorded as Samuel Fowler, market gardener. Annie, age 35, died 1 September 1912 from retained placenta and puerperal septicaemia and was buried at Roy Cove. George was married to (3) **Violet Lilian Mabel Pearl LEE** prior to May 1931. (*no record of marriage in Falkland Islands*). George had a stroke 15 May 1937. George, age 63 and a shepherd, died 31 July 1937 and was buried 2 August 1937 in Grave J1109. Violet, age 64 and a domestic, travelled to Montevideo for hospital treatment November 1967 and died there 29 November 1967. [FI Monthly Review 4 Dec 1967]
4. **William Wickham GOODWIN** born 30 June 1876 at Roy Cove and baptised 16 January 1878 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. William died 23 May 1888 from inflammation of the brain and pneumonia of the lungs (*no burial or Grave record*)

5. **John GOODWIN** born 28 December 1877 at Roy Cove and baptised 16 January 1878 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. John, a shepherd, was married to **Sybella McLEOD** 23 October 1903 at Dunbar House, Roy Cove, West Falkland by C K Blount MA Assistant Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were William Biggs and Mary McLeod. John's father was recorded as John Goodwin, shepherd, and Sybella's father was recorded as Kenneth McLeod, shepherd. [Account of wedding FIM Dec 1903] John, age 74 and a retired shepherd, died 25 October 1951 and was buried 26 October 1951 in Grave 1467. Sybella Catherine Ann Goodwin, age 72, died 16 October 1957 in Stanley and was buried 19 October 1957 in Grave P1598.
6. **James GOODWIN** born circa 1879 (*no record of birth or baptism in the Falkland Islands*). James, age 22 and a shepherd at Roy Cove, was married to (1) **Alexandrina ANDERSON**, age 20, 11 August 1902 in the Parish Church according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church after Banns by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were J Anderson and Mary Clifton. James' father was recorded as John Goodwin, head shepherd, and Alexandrina's father was recorded as James Anderson, mariner. [Account of wedding FIM Sep 1902] Alexandrina died 21 September 1935 at Port Howard, age 53 from a cerebral haemorrhage and was buried at Port Howard. [Obituary Penguin 25 Sep 1935] James was married to (2) **Catherine Margaret RUTTER**, housekeeper, 15 July 1939 at the Manager's House, Port San Carlos, East Falkland by Special Licence by D M Honeyman, Deputy Registrar. The witnesses were Elizabeth Margaret Mary Morrison and Murdo Morrison. James' father was recorded as John Goodwin, deceased and Catherine's father was recorded as Henry Rutter, deceased. Catherine, age 72, died 21 January 1961 in Stanley and was buried 24 January 1961 in Grave R1688. James, age 81 and a retired shepherd, died 17 January 1962 in Stanley and was buried 19 January 1962 in Grave R1710
7. **Mary Anne GOODWIN** born 16 August 1880 at Roy Cove, West Falkland. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Mary Ann was married to **William James BIGGS**, shepherd, 2 June 1904 at Christ Church Cathedral, Stanley after Banns by C K Blount MA Acting Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were William McGill, Lily Biggs and John F Summers. Mary Ann's father was recorded as John Goodwin, shepherd, and William's father was recorded as Edward Biggs, labourer.
8. **Grace GOODWIN** born 7 January 1883 at Dunbar and baptised 28 March 1884 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Grace was married to **James Julian PERRY**, shepherd, 16 March 1904 at Stanley by Special Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Charles John Perry and George Goodwin. Grace's father was recorded as John Goodwin, shepherd, and John's father was recorded as John Perry, navy. Grace died 8 February 1925, age 42, of carcinoma of the breast and was buried in Grave J916. John died 18 May 1947, age 70, and was buried in Grave J1341.
9. **Jennet GOODWIN** born 29 July 1884 and baptised **Janet GOODWIN** 18 May 1885 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Janet was married to **George HALLIDAY**, farm labourer, 23 October 1903 at Dunbar House, Roy Cove, West Falkland by C K Blount MA Assistant Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were James Goodwin and Mary Ann Goodwin. Janet's father was recorded as John Goodwin, shepherd and George's father was recorded as Andrew Halliday, shepherd. [Account of wedding FIM Dec 1903] Janet died 27 April 1952 and was buried in Grave 1481. George died 21 July 1967 at New Island and was buried in Grave T2078.

10. **William GOODWIN** born 30 December 1890 at Dunbar Harbour and baptised 28 February 1891 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. William, a shepherd, was married to **Mary Ann HEWITT**, widow, 7 June 1926 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Registrar's Licence by W Barlas, Deputy Registrar General. The witnesses were H C Ley and M E Evans. William's father was recorded as John Goodwin, deceased, and Mary's father was recorded as Robert Cartmell, deceased. William, age 70 and a dairy farmer, died 27 July 1960 in Stanley and was buried 29 July 1960 in Grave Q1675. Mary, age 81, died as the result of blast injuries 14 June 1982 in Stanley when the house she was in was struck by a shell and was buried 18 June 1982 in Grave R1978.

Children of Thomas (2) and Sarah GOODWIN:

1. **William Thomas GOODWIN** born 26 August 1888 at Laguna Isla and baptised 2 October 1888 by the Non-conformist Church. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. William started work for the Falkland Islands Company Limited 3 December 1900 on 30/- a day. By 31 December 1902 he was earning £2-10-0 a month. [FIC A1, pg 802; A2, pg 285] William went to Dumfries, Scotland with his parents in 1903, leaving Stanley 7 January 1903 on the *Orellana* bound for Liverpool. [FIM Feb 1903]
2. **James McLean 'Jim' GOODWIN** born 25 December 1889 at Laguna Isla and baptised 16 February 1890 by the Non-conformist Church. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. James went to Dumfries, Scotland with his parents in 1903, leaving Stanley 7 January 1903 on the *Orellana* bound for Liverpool. [FIM Feb 1903] James was married to **Ruby Minnie RANSOM**, age 26, in 1916 in Australia. Ruby, age 60, died 13 June 1950 and was buried 14 June 1950 in Cheltenham Memorial Cemetery, Cheltenham, Bayside City, Victoria. James, age 69 and a railways employee, died 4 June 1959 in Sandringham, Victoria, Australia and was buried 8 June 1959 in Cheltenham Memorial Cemetery, Cheltenham, Bayside City, Victoria.
3. **Agnes Grace GOODWIN** born 27 May 1891 at Laguna Isla and baptised 10 October 1891 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Agnes went to Dumfries, Scotland with her parents in 1903, leaving Stanley 7 January 1903 on the *Orellana* bound for Liverpool. [FIM Feb 1903]
4. **John Gilbert GOODWIN** born 14 June 1893 at Laguna Isla and baptised 31 August 1893 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. John went to Dumfries, Scotland with his parents in 1903, leaving Stanley 7 January 1903 on the *Orellana* bound for Liverpool. [FIM Feb 1903]
5. **Mary Ellen GOODWIN** born 1 April 1895 at Laguna Isla and baptised 3 May 1895 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Mary went to Dumfries, Scotland with her parents in 1903, leaving Stanley 7 January 1903 on the *Orellana* bound for Liverpool. [FIM Feb 1903]
6. **Robert David GOODWIN** born 18 March 1897 at Laguna Isla and baptised 27 April 1897 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Robert went to Dumfries, Scotland with his parents in 1903, leaving Stanley 7 January 1903 on the *Orellana* bound for Liverpool. [FIM Feb 1903]

SECOND GENERATION:

Children of Thomas (1) (1) and Emily GOODWIN:

1. **Harriet Janet GOODWIN** born 29 April 1895 and baptised 30 March 1896 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Harriet was married to **William KIVELL**, labourer, 2 February 1921 at Port Stephens, West Falkland by Registrar's Licence by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were George Goodwin and Emily Goodwin. Harriet's father was recorded as Thomas Goodwin, shepherd and William's father was recorded as Richard Kivell, deceased farmer. Harriet, age 64, died 29 February 1960 in Stanley and was buried 2 March 1960 in Grave S1660. William, age 86 and a farmhand, died 25 August 1967 in Stanley and was buried 29 August 1967 in Grave T2081
2. **John Alexander GOODWIN** born 15 November 1896 at Shallow Bay and baptised 25 November 1896 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. John died at Shallow Bay 30 June 1897, age 7 months, from exhaustion following severe burns after falling into a fire and was buried at Hill Cove. [Account of death FIM Aug 1897]
3. **George William Thomas GOODWIN** born 26 September 1898 at Shallow Bay and baptised 21 October 1898 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. George died 11 July 1929, age 30, from morbus cordis on the West Falkland and is buried at Port Stephens.

Children of Elizabeth (1) (2) and Peter LLAMOSA:

1. **Peter CHAMOSA** born 31 July 1889 in Stanley and baptised 20 August 1889 by Holy Trinity Church. Peter died 22 September 1890 at Dunbar Harbour from meningitis and is buried in Grave Ei447.
2. **William John "Bill" LLAMOSA** born 26 August 1891 in Quile Ake, Argentina and baptised 12 March 1893 by Christ Church Cathedral, Falkland Islands. Bill first worked on Saunders Islands for 3 ½ years before working for Port Howard Farm for 56 years, over 50 of them alone at the Warrah. [Account of retirement from Port Howard FI Monthly Review 6 July 1964] Bill, a shepherd, retired to Australia in 1966. [Account of leaving FI Monthly Review 6 June 1966]
3. **George Alexander LLAMOSA** born 1 July 1893 in Patagonia, Argentina and baptised 3 December 1893 by Christ Church Cathedral. George worked for Port Howard Farm for 55 years, 25 of them at Purvis. [Account of retirement from Port Howard FI Monthly Review 6 July 1964] George, a farm worker, died 29 May 1979 in Stanley and is buried in Grave U1944.
4. **Rose Emily CHAMOSA** born 21 July 1895 at Hill Cove. Rose was married to **John Crook SMITH**, shepherd, 1 July 1913 at Port Howard by C McDonald Hobley, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Peter Llamosa and William John Llamosa. John's father was recorded as John Crook Smith, cooper. John died 15 May 1949, age 60, and is buried in Grave Q1404. Rose went to Montevideo in 1951 for medical treatment.
5. **Violet Alberta LLAMOSA** born 5 April 1898 at Roy Cove. Violet was married to **Frederick William JOHNSON**, carter, 24 April 1923 at Port Howard, West Falkland by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were John Crook Smith and Stanley Howard Johnson. Frederick's father was recorded as George Frederick Johnson, foreman. [Account

of wedding FI Magazine July 1923] Frederick died 27 August 1968 and is buried in Grave T2115. Violet died 15 May 1988 and is buried in Grave T2116.

6. **Elsie Grace CHAMOSA** born 28 November 1900 at Hill Cove. Elsie was married to **James Watson Cranmer PECK**, shepherd, 6 August 1925 at Pebble Island, West Falkland by Special Licence by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were William D N Betts and Hyacinth Emily Betts. James' father was recorded as John Peck, gardener. [Account of wedding FI Magazine October 1925] James died 19 January 1980 at Stanley and is buried in Grave U1952. Elsie died 20 May 1989, age 88, and is buried in Grave U1953.
7. **Arthur James CHAMOSA** born 21 November 1902 at Hill Cove. Shepherd. Arthur was married to **Rosina Winifred LEE** 22 April 1929 at Port Howard, West Falklands by Special Licence by S E E Aylward, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Edwin Thomas Lee and Ellen Elizabeth Smith. Rosina's father was recorded as Edwin James Lee, shepherd.
8. **Beatrice Maud LLAMOSA** born 4 June 1907 on Saunders Island. Beatrice was married to (1) **Francis George "Frank" PERRING**, shepherd, 19 May 1928 at Port Howard, West Falkland by Special Licence by S E E Aylward, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Frederick George Berntsen and Ellen Elizabeth Smith. Frank's father was recorded as George John Friend Perring, mariner. Frank died 30 October 1948 at Port Howard, age 47, from natural causes (*no burial record*).
Beatrice was married to (2) **Robert Petrie CRAIG**, shepherd, 23 February 1951 at Port Howard, West Falkland by D M Pole-Evans, JP. The witnesses were S P Johnson and G M Peck. Robert's father was recorded as Andrew Petrie Craig, farm labourer. Robert and Beatrice emigrated to the UK in 1951.

Children of George (1) (3) and Alice GOODWIN:

1. **George John Nathaniel GOODWIN** born circa 18 October 1905 in Winnipeg, Canada. George, age 9 months and 14 days, died 1 August 1906 at 282 Magnus Avenue, Winnipeg, Canada. [Obituary FIM Jan 1906]

Children of George (1) (3) and Annie GOODWIN:

1. **Elsie Gladys GOODWIN** born 5 August 1912 and baptised **Elsie Gladys Marjorie GOODWIN** 18 February 1913 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Elsie was married to **William John DAVIS**, farm labourer 4 May 1931 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by Fredk S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were James Watson Peck and Agnes Maud Butcher. Elsie's father was recorded as George Goodwin, shepherd and William's father was recorded as Richard Davis, labourer. Elsie, age 78 and late of Salvador, died 8 June 1991 in Stanley and was buried 12 June 1991 in Grave V3156. William, age 86 and a retired farm worker, died 31 July 1995 in Stanley and was buried 4 August 1995 in Grave V3157.

Children of George (1) (3) and Violet GOODWIN:

- a. **Olive Elizabeth GOODWIN** born 19 May 1931 at Hill Cove and baptised 9 April 1932 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Olive, a domestic servant, was married to **Thomas George ALDRIDGE**, shepherd, 23 April 1949 at Hill Cove, West Falkland by H C Harding, Registrar. The witnesses were J Johnson

and J A Duncan. Olive's father was recorded as George Goodwin, deceased shepherd, and Thomas' father was recorded as William Thomas Aldridge, deceased butcher. Thomas, age 67 & living at Hill Cove, died 28 June 1986 and was buried 3 July 1986 in Grave V3061. Olive, age 77 & living at Hill Cove, died 29 May 2008 and was buried 2 June 2008 in Grave V3423.

- b. **Rose Emily GOODWIN** born 24 March 1933 at Hill Cove and baptised **Rosalie Emily GOODWIN** 15 November 1933 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Rosalie, a domestic servant, died 23 December 1947 from swallowing poison while mentally deranged and was buried 24 December 1947 in Grave P1365.

- 1. **John Kenneth GOODWIN** born 11 September 1904 at Dunbar. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. John, a labourer, was married to **Mary Agnes Alice Crawford "Molly" DICKSON** 28 September 1934 at Fox Bay by Registrar's Licence by William B Myles, Deputy Registrar. The witnesses were John Stanley Lang and Kathleen E Dickson. John's father was recorded as John Goodwin, shepherd and Molly's father was recorded as John Dickson, shepherd. John, age 78 and retired, died 5 December 1982 and was buried 10 December 1982 in Grave V1989. Molly, age 73, died 15 July 1985 and was buried 18 July 1985 in Grave V3035.
- 2. **Thomas James Westbourne "Tommy" GOODWIN** born 13 September 1905 at Roy Cove and baptised 29 July 1906 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Thomas, a navvy, was married to **Dorothy Grace DAVIS** 27 June 1934 at Hill Cove by Registrar's Licence by William Henry Luxton, Sheep farmer, Justice of Peace. The witnesses were Frederick John Cheek and Grace Elizabeth Goodwin. Thomas' father was recorded as John Goodwin shepherd and Dorothy's father was recorded as Richard Davis, workman. Thomas worked for the Falkland Islands Co Ltd as a van driver and as a mason's mate from 1 February 1954 to 18 January 1957. Previous to moving to Stanley to live he had worked for approximately 25 years on an FIC farm. [FIC/EF] Thomas, a truck driver, and Dorothy went on holiday to the UK in 1956.
- 3. **Ernest Gilbert "Con" GOODWIN** born 18 September 1907 at Crooked Inlet, Hill Cove and baptised 11 March 1908 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Ernest was baptised again by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church 2 October 1936. Ernest, a labourer, went on holiday to the UK in 1937. Ernest, age 69 and a retired farm worker, died 25 June 1977 in Stanley and was buried 28 June 1977 in Grave R1891.
- 4. **David George GOODWIN** born 18 October 1909 at Crooked Inlet, Hill Cove and baptised 14 February 1910 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as

shepherd. David, a shepherd, was married to (1) **Lily Edith Maud BUTLER** 27 August 1931 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by G R L Brown, Registrar General. The witnesses were Alexis Boyer and E Goodwin. David's father was recorded as John Goodwin, shepherd and Lily's father was recorded as Joseph James Butler, shepherd. Lily died from diabetes 13 July 1932 (*no burial or grave record*). David, a widower and shepherd, was married to (2) **Isabella Helena "Lena" KIDDLE**, widow, 5 September 1937 at Chartres, West Falkland by Registrar General's Licence by William Henry Luxton, Justice of the Peace. The witnesses were E Rutter and B Hardy. David's father was recorded as John Goodwin, shepherd and Isabella's father was recorded as Henry Henriksen, labourer. David, age 65 and a retired farm worker, died 4 June 1975 in Stanley and was buried 30 May 1975 in Grave U1849. Lena died 1 September 1985, age 85, and was buried 4 September 1985 in Grave U1850.

5. **Vincent Stanley GOODWIN** born 26 April 1911 at Crooked Inlet, Hill Cove, West Falkland and baptised 17 May 1911 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Vincent, a gardener and farm worker, died 8 August 1971 on Saunders Island and was buried 11 August 1971 in Grave U2168.
6. **Rupert Vall "Bizz" (after German battle ship Bismarck) GOODWIN** born 18 December 1912 at Crooked Inlet, Hill Cove, West Falkland and baptised **Rupert Valentine** 24 February 1913 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Rupert, a shepherd, was married to **Kathleen Edith Margurite JONES** 4 May 1937 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by Gerald K Lowe, Chaplain. The witnesses were John F C Jones and Grace E Goodwin. Rupert's father was recorded as John James Goodwin, shepherd and Kathleen's father was recorded as John William Jones, cook. Rupert, age 69, died 4 May 1982 at Fitzroy during the Argentine occupation of the Falkland Islands and was buried at Fitzroy 5 May 1982. Kathleen, age 90 and a pensioner, died 5 July 2004.
7. **Bert Samuel GOODWIN** born 16 November 1915 at Roy Cove and baptised 7 February 1916. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Bert, a labourer, was married to **Hazel Rose BONNER**, widow, 7 October 1966 at 96 Davis Street, Stanley by Harold Bennett, Registrar General. The witnesses were J Stephenson and Joan Stephenson. Bert's father was recorded as John Goodwin, deceased, and Hazel's father was recorded as Herbert Percival Biggs, deceased labourer. Bert, age 76 and a pensioner living in 3 Police Cottages, Stanley, died 6 August 1992 and was buried 12 August 1992 in Grave 3176.
8. **Grace Elizabeth GOODWIN** born 13 July 1917 at Dunbar, Roy Cove Station and baptised **Grace Isabella GOODWIN** 13 December 1917 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Grace was married to (1) **Horace Harold BIGGS**, labourer, 5 August 1948 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by J E Hamilton, Registrar General. The witnesses were Mrs Betty Goodwin and N Binnie. Grace's father was recorded as John Goodwin, labourer, and Horace's father was recorded as Albert Edward Biggs, retired. Horace, age 59 and a labourer, died 4 February 1960 in Stanley and was buried 6 February 1960 in Grave S1658. Grace, a widow, was married to (2) **William Charles ALAZIA**, widower and publican, 1 July 1961 at the Office of the Registrar General, Stanley by Harold Bennett, Registrar General. The witnesses were A F Alazia, T Alazia and S Alazia. Grace's father was recorded as John Goodwin, deceased shepherd, and William's father was recorded as William Joseph Alazia, deceased shepherd. Grace, age 60, died in Stanley 25 August 1977 and was buried 27 August 1977 in Grave U1897. William, age 62, died in Stanley 21 August 1980 and was buried 23 August 1980 in Grave U1957.

9. **Aubrey William GOODWIN** born 30 June 1920 at Dunbar and baptised 21 February 1921 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Aubrey, a shepherd, was married to **Ada Margaret McLEOD**, widow, 1 February 1942 at the Deputy Registrar's Office Fox Bay by W B Myles, Deputy Registrar. The witnesses were Grace Elizabeth Goodwin and Albert F Binnie. Aubrey's father was recorded as John Goodwin, caretaker and Ada's father was recorded as Benjamin Davis, deceased assistant manager. Aubrey and Ada divorced in 1950 and Ada was married to (2) **William John POOLE**.
10. **Douglas Clarence GOODWIN** born 4 June 1922 at Dunbar, Roy Cove and baptised **Douglas Sturdee GOODWIN** 6 May 1923 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Douglas, a private in the FIDF, was married to (1) **Elizabeth Nellie McLEOD** 9 January 1943 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by J E Hamilton, Registrar General. The witnesses were Mrs Annie Halliday and James Andrew Halliday. Douglas' father was recorded as John Goodwin, labourer and Elizabeth's father was recorded as Donald John McLeod, labourer. Douglas and Elizabeth were divorced in 1954 and Elizabeth married Edward Bernard ANDERSON. Douglas was married to (2) **Sarah Maggie Rosie "Rose" McMILLAN** formerly **JAFFRAY** 19 June 1957 at the Office of the Registrar General, Stanley by Harold Bennett, Registrar General. The witnesses were M Clarke and Jane E McKay. Douglas' father was recorded as John Goodwin, deceased shepherd, and Sarah's father was recorded as Alexander Jaffray, shepherd. Douglas, age 63 and a farmer on Great Island, died 29 September 1985 and was buried 3 October 1985 in Grave V3046. Sarah, age 63 and living in Dairy Paddock Road, died 2 June 1991 at Wendover, England. Sarah was buried 25 June 1991 in Grave V3047. [Obituary PN 28 Jun 1991]

James, a fireman, was married to **Ada Annie Elizabeth JOHNSON**, domestic servant, 16 October 1943 at the Nonconformist Church (Tabernacle), Stanley by Banns by Walter Forrest McWhan, Nonconformist Minister. The witnesses were J A King and E V Johnson. James' father was recorded as James Goodwin, shepherd, and Ada's father was recorded as Edward Victor Johnson, foreman. In March 1944 James was a fireman on board the ss *San Casto*. He had signed on 12 November 1943. [FIC/EF/] James, a labourer, travelled to Montevideo for medical treatment in 1945.
