

SIMPSON FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Any variations which may occur in the spellings of names are recorded as written in the records at the time.

Thomas SIMPSON was born circa 1806 (*not in the Falkland Islands*). Thomas was married to **Hannah SPONG** (*not in the Falkland Islands*). Thomas, Hannah and their children Hannah, Harriet and Frank arrived 13 October 1849 on board the *Victory*. In the census of 22 February 1851 Thomas was recorded as a 45 year old shoemaker and pensioner and Hannah was recorded as age 31.

Thomas, age either 47 or 53 and a cordwaner, died in Stanley 14 April 1855 and was buried 16 April 1855 in Grave F 479 or F 480.

Hannah, a widow, was married to (2) **James ANDREWS**, a ships carpenter, 22 December 1856 by Henry Martyn Faulkner, Colonial Chaplain in Holy Trinity Church by Banns, both of full age. Both James and Hannah signed with a X. The witnesses were Joseph Beldon and C M Supple.

Hannah, age 46 and the wife of James Andrews & widow of Thomas Simpson Pensioner, died in Stanley 22 March 1865 from general debility and was buried 26 March 1865 in Grave F 479 or F 480.

Children of Thomas and Hannah SIMPSON:

1. **Hannah SIMPSON** born circa December 1843 in England. Hannah arrived with her family on board the *Victory* 13 Oct 1849. Hannah was recorded as being age 8 in the census of 22 February 1851. Hannah was recorded as being age 11 in the return of the Government School of 1 April 1855. [H8] Hannah, age 18 & from England, was married to **George SHORT**, age 24 and a labourer, 20 February 1862 at Trinity Church Stanley according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Church of England after Banns by Charles Bull MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Harriet Ann Simpson, Emile Boyer and Harry Hollen. George's father was recorded as John Short, pensioner, and Hannah's father was recorded as Thomas Simpson, pensioner. Hannah, age 26 years and 3 months, died 20 March 1870 in Stanley from scarlet fever and was buried 24 March 1870 in Grave D320.
2. **Harriet Ann SIMPSON** born circa 1845 in Windsor, England. Harriet arrived with her family on board the *Victory* 13 Oct 1849. Harriet was recorded as being age 6 in the census of 22 February 1851. Harriet was recorded as being age 9 in the return of the Government School of 1 April 1855. [H8] Harriet, age 18 and a domestic servant from Windsor, England living in the Parsonage, was married to **James Samuel BIGGS**, carpenter from Woolwich, England, 25 February 1864 at Trinity Church Stanley according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Church of England after Banns by Charles Bull MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Edward Biggs and G Short. James' father was recorded as James Biggs, pensioner, and Harriet's father was recorded as Thomas Simpson, pensioner. Harriet, age 29, died in Stanley 27 April 1875 and was buried in 2 May 1875 in Grave F477. James, age 50, died 9 May 1891 and was buried at Roy Cove.
3. **Francis SIMPSON** born circa 1848 (*not in the Falkland Islands*). Frank arrived with his family on board the *Victory* 13 Oct 1849. Frank was recorded as being age 3 in the census of 22 February 1851. Francis was recorded as being age 8 in the return of the Government School of 1 April 1855. [H8] Francis, an English gaucho living at Darwin, was married to **Mary Ann McKINNON** 14 August 1872 at Darwin according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church, after banns, by A Yeoman Presbyterian Minister. The witnesses were Andrew Kyle and Maggie Fell. Francis' father was recorded as Thomas Simpson, shoemaker and pensioner, and Mary's father was recorded as Norman McKinnon, shepherd. Francis, age 89, died in Stanley 16 November 1926 and was buried 18 November 1926 in Grave K950. Mary, age 78, died in Stanley 25 November 1926 and was buried 28 November 1926 in Grave K954.
4. **Malvena SIMPSON** born 29 October 1849 in Stanley and baptised 2 December 1849 by Holy Trinity Church. Malvina was recorded as being age 1 in the census of 22 February 1851. Malvina, age 2, died in the Barracks, Stanley and was buried 27 December 1851 in Grave F 578 or F 579.
5. **Catherine SIMPSON** born 5 January 1853 in Stanley and baptised 23 January 1853 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shoemaker and pensioner. Catherine, age 5, died in Stanley 11 March 1858 from putrid sore throat and was buried 12 March 1858 in Grave F 578 or Grave F 579.

FIRST GENERATION:

Children of Hannah SIMPSON (1) and James ANDREWS:

- a. **Ellen ANDREWS** born 19 February 1859 in Stanley and baptised **Ella Elizabeth ANDREWS** 20 June 1859 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as ship carpenter. Ellen, age 20 and a servant, was married to **George John Francis PERRING**, mate on board the *Fairy*, 4 August 1878 in the Parish Church according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were James Andrews and Elizabeth Allen. Ellen signed with a X. George's father was recorded as George Perring, carter, and Ellen's father was recorded as James Andrews, shipwright. George, age 75, died 15 March 1925 and was buried 16 March 1925 in Grave K 919. Ellen, age 68, died 30 September 1927.

Children of Hannah (1) and George SHORT

1. **John Thomas SHORT** born 1 June 1863 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. John, a carpenter living in Stanley, was married to **Mary Ann BETTS**, age 22 and living in Stanley, 11 September 1889 in the Service room according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church after Banns by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were George Short and Amy Rutter. Mary's father was recorded as John Betts, carter. John died 22 July 1945 and is buried in Grave E1268. Mary died 16 April 1953 and is buried in Grave 1508.
2. **Richard Francis SHORT** born 21 August 1865 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Richard, a shepherd at San Carlos, was married to **Ellen GLEADELL**, age 19 and living at San Carlos, 22 September 1892 at San Carlos in the house of Daniel Cusack according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Joseph Edward Tait and Daniel Cusack. Ellen's father was recorded as Enoch Gleadell, shepherd. Ellen died 27 January 1924 and is buried in Grave J895. Richard died 21 February 1937 and is buried in Grave K1105.
3. **Charles SHORT** born 12 December 1867 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as butcher. Charles, a shepherd at New House, Douglas Station, was married to **Ada Margaret PITALUGA**, age 19 and living at Montevideo, Douglas Station, 31 May 1899 in the house of Mr Blakeley at Sierra Montevideo according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Richard Francis Short and Annie Maude Atkins. Ada's father was recorded as James Pitaluga, gaucho. On Saturday 20 September 1902 Charles was assisting in unloading a cart in the Government Store, Stanley, when a case or iron fell on his foot and ankle. By 22 October he was able to get around a little with the aid of a stick. [CM Nov 1902] Ada died 23 October 1903 from peritonitis and is buried in Grave D321. Charles, manager of a sheep farm, died 1 June 1951 and is buried in Grave 1453.
4. **Frederick SHORT** born 11 March 1870 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as butcher. Frederick, a butcher, was married to **Eliza Rebecca**

HITCHMAN, 25 September 1911 at Mr Short's House by Edward J Seymour, Dean & Chaplain. The witnesses were F H Petersen and Grace Petersen. Eliza's father was recorded as John Thomas Hitchman, draper.

Children of Harriet (2) and James BIGGS:

1. **Hannah Elizabeth BIGGS** born 24 November 1864 in Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter.
2. **James Thomas BIGGS** born 16 June 1866 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. James, age 21 & a carter living at Roy Cove, was married to **Rose Emily Margaret SUMMERS**, living at Port North, 6 October 1887 at Port North, Roy Cove, West Falkland according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial. The witnesses were Edward Falkland Biggs and Alma Phoebe Biggs. James' father was recorded as James Samuel Biggs, carpenter. Rose died 14 November 1896 from acute gastritis and is buried at Roy Cove.
3. **Emily Amelia BIGGS** born 5 July 1869 at Darwin. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter.
4. **Margaret Margery BIGGS** born 3 January 1872 in Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter.

Children of Francis (3) and Mary SIMPSON:

1. **Hannah SIMPSON** born 5 August 1874 at Port Purvis, West Falkland. Her father's occupation was recorded as herdsman. Hannah, age 16 and living at Shag Cove, Port Howard, was married to **Alfred Vincent LEE**, age 26 and a shepherd living at Green Hill, Port Howard, 8 September 1890 in the house of Francis Simpson, Shag Cove, Port Howard according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Francis Simpson and Jacob John Lee. Alfred's father was recorded as Jacob Lee, shepherd, and Hannah's father was recorded as Francis Simpson, shepherd. Joseph (Alfred) died 8 July 1928, age 65, and was buried 10 July 1928 in Grave J979. His house on the south-east corner of Davis and Dean Street was transferred to Hannah. Hannah died 13 December 1947, age 73, and was buried in Grave P1361.
2. **Thomas Francis "Tim" SIMPSON** born 23 March 1876 at Shag Harbour, West Falkland. His father's occupation was recorded as herdsman. Thomas, age 69, died at Port Howard 6 May 1945 from burns from an accidental fire and was buried at Port Howard.
3. **Mary Ann SIMPSON** born 9 February 1878 at Shag Cove, West Falkland and baptised 6 June 1878 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as herdsman. Mary, age 17 and living at White Rock, Port Howard, was married to **Alexander McLEOD**, age 27 and a shepherd living at White Rock, Port Howard, 5 July 1894 at Shag Cove Port Howard according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA

Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Henry Gilbert and Thomas Simpson. Alexander's father was recorded as Donald McLeod, joiner, and Mary's father was recorded as Francis Simpson, shepherd. Alexander died 19 May 1933. Mary Ann, the widow of Alexander, shepherd boss, died 29 August 1951.

4. **George Henry SIMPSON** born 4 January 1880 at Shag Cove, West Falkland and baptised 6 February 1880 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as herdsman. George, age 79 and a retired shepherd, died 2 September 1959 in Stanley and was buried 5 September 1959 in Grave S1645.
5. **Catherine Marion SIMPSON** born 25 August 1881 at Hill Gap and baptised 9 June 1882 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as herdsman. Catherine, living in Stanley, was married to **Frederick George LEE**, shepherd at Mount Rosalie, Port Howard, 18 July 1906 at Christ Church Cathedral, Stanley by Special Licence No 79 by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Francis Simpson and George Henry Simpson. Frederick's father was recorded as Jacob Lee, shepherd, and Catherine's father was recorded as Francis Simpson, shepherd. Catherine died 18 February 1959 in Stanley, age 77, and was buried 21 February 1959 in Grave S1774. Frederick, age 95 and a retired shepherd, died 22 October 1967 in Stanley and was buried 26 October 1967 in Grave S1774.
6. **Harriet Christina SIMPSON** born 22 March 1883 on West Falkland and baptised 8 March 1884 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as herdsman. Harriet was married to **Alfred Edward DEARLING**, cook, 2 June 1919 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Alexander McLeod, Mary McLeod and Francis Simpson. Alfred's father was recorded as Henry James Dearling, deceased printer, and Harriet's father was recorded as Francis Simpson, gardener. Harriet, age 68, died 25 June 1951 and was buried in Grave 1456. Alfred, age 78 and a gardener from England, died 9 November 1953 and was buried 11 November 1953 in Grave 1523.
7. **Alexander Spong SIMPSON** born 5 December 1884 and baptised 25 May 1885 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as gaucho. Alexander, age 86 and a gardener, died 25 March 1971 in Stanley and was buried 27 March 1971 in Grave T2160.
8. **Francis SIMPSON** born 17 August 1886 and baptised **Richard Francis SIMPSON** 12 May 1887 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as gaucho. Francis, age 19 yrs & 10mths and a labourer at Port Howard, died from tubercular peritonitis and was buried 16 June 1906 in Grave F481.

SECOND GENERATION:

Children of Ellen (1) (a) and George PERRING:

1. **Blanche Emma PERRING** born 20 June 1879 in Stanley and baptised 20 July 1879 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Blanche was married to **Abner Marentius Napoleon BERNTSEN**, carter, 26 November 1905 at Christ Church Cathedral, Stanley by C K Blount MA Assistant Priest Christ Church. The witnesses were Frederick George Berntsen and Ellen Mary Dettleff. Blanche's father was George John Friend Perring, mariner. Blanche died 10 November 1921, age 42, from endocarditis and a cerebral embolism and is buried in Grave K864. Abner died 31 March 1923 from heart disease and is buried in Grave K885. He was a labourer at the time.
2. **Francis George PERRING** born 5 December 1900 and baptised 30 December 1900 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Francis, a shepherd, was married to **Beatrice Maud LLAMOSA** 19 May 1928 at Port Howard, West Falkland by Special Licence by S E E Aylward, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Frederick George Berntsen and Ellen Elizabeth Smith. Frank's father was recorded as George John Friend Perring, mariner, and Beatrice's father was recorded as Peter Llamosa, shepherd. Frank died 30 October 1948 at Port Howard, age 47, from natural causes (*no burial record*). Beatrice was married to (2) **Robert Petrie CRAIG**, shepherd, 23 February 1951 at Port Howard, West Falkland by D M Pole-Evans, JP. The witnesses were S P Johnson and G M Peck. Robert's father was recorded as Andrew Petrie Craig, farm labourer. Robert and Beatrice emigrated to the UK in 1951.

Children of John (1) (1) and Mary SHORT:

1. **Hannah Margaret SHORT** born 18 June 1890 at Roy Cove. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Died 21 November 1890 at Roy Cove and is buried in Grave A73.
2. **Hannah Violet SHORT** born 14 February 1892. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Married to **William George Edmund PECK**, shepherd, 25 April 1912 at San Carlos South by Governor's Special Licence by Edward J Seymour, Dean & Chaplain. The witnesses were Henry Charles Betts and Lilian May Short. William's father was recorded as William Peck, shepherd. Hannah died 3 February 1945, age 52, and is buried in Grave O1293. William, a caretaker, was married to (2) **Mary "Mollie" McLEOD** 5 October 1946 at St Mary's Catholic Church, Stanley by Hugh F Drumm, RC Priest. The witnesses were Desmond Peck and Christina Maud Shedden. William died 13 July 1979 at Stanley and is buried in Grave R1945. Mary died 7 March 1995, age 78, and is buried in Grave V3227.
3. **Margaret Jane SHORT** born 2 April 1894. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Margaret, a maid, was married to **Sidney Edmund BROWELL**, police constable from London, 11 March 1933 by W Barlas, Deputy Registrar, in Registrar-General's Office South Georgia. The witnesses were M Mercer and J Mercer. Sidney's father was recorded as William Browell, stoker engineer.

4. **Lilian "Lily" May SHORT** born 10 May 1896. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Lily was married to **Donald Alex McRAE**, shepherd, 2 September 1920 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Archie Short and Margaret Jane Short. Donald's father was recorded as Farquhar McRae, deceased foreman. Lily died 2 December 1949 and is buried in Grave L1418. Donald died 2 April 1959 in Stanley and is buried in Grave L1628.
5. **George John Archibald SHORT** born 29 March 1898. His father's occupation was recorded as shipwright. George, a shepherd, was married to **Marian Agnes ROBERTS**, 20 September 1928 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by S E E Aylward, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were George Henry Osborne and Dorothy Mabel Short. John's father was recorded as John Thomas Short, caretaker, and Mary's father was recorded as Edgar Roberts, shepherd. Agnes, age 71, died 11 February 1979 on Beaver Island and was buried 14 February 1979 in Grave R 1939. George died 12 February 1986 and is buried in Grave V3051.
6. **Elsie Winifred SHORT** born 3 January 1902. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Elsie was married to **Thomas Dunraven HARDY**, assistant lighthouse keeper, 10 November 1927 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by Fredk S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were F J Hardy and A E Short. Thomas' father was recorded as Frederick J Hardy, deceased clerk.
7. **Elizabeth Ada SHORT** born 17 May 1903. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Elizabeth was married to Andrew Roger PECK, labourer, 26 September 1936 at St Mary's Catholic Church, Stanley by Banns by Hugh Drum, RC Priest. The witnesses were William George Edmond Peck and Mary H C McRae. Elizabeth emigrated to the UK in 1971. Andrew died 5 July 1977 at Stanley and is buried in Grave O1894. Andrew's father was recorded as William Peck, deceased policeman.
8. **Dorothy SHORT** born 21 February 1907 at San Carlos South. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Dorothy was married to **George Henry OSBORNE**, labourer, 27 August 1931 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by Fredk S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Martin Henricksen and Ada Short. George's father was recorded as George Osborne, mariner. Dorothy and George emigrated to New Zealand via England in 1956.
9. **Frederick George SHORT** born 18 November 1908 at Port San Carlos. His father's occupation was recorded as gardener. Frederick, a labourer, was married to **Daisy Beatrice Louisa Mary BUTLER**, a domestic servant, 28 June 1932 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by Harold E Lumsdale, Dean of Christ Church. The witnesses were E A Short and R Grant. Frederick's father was recorded as John Thomas Short, joiner. Daisy died 22 October 1974 in Stanley and is buried in Grave U1840. Frederick died 7 February 1985 and is buried in Grave U1841.

Children of Charles (1) (3) and Ada SHORT:

1. **Mary Ann SHORT** born 26 April 1900. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Mary, an assistant school teacher, was married to **John Charles OSBORNE**, assistant store keeper, 14 January 1930 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by F S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were G H Osborne and J Luxton. John's father was recorded as George Osborne, seaman, and Mary's father was recorded as Charles Henry Short, shepherd.
2. **Isabella SHORT** born 14 June 1902. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Isabella was married to **Stanley Charles LUXTON**, painter, 1 September 1926 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by Fredk T Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were John Markham Campbell and Mary Ann Short. Stanley's father was recorded as John Thomas Luxton, cabinet maker, and Isabella's father was recorded as Charles Henry Short, farm manager.
3. **George Henry SHORT** born 11 October 1903 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as carter. George, a cook, was married to **Christina MORRISON** 20 November 1929 at Douglas Station, East Falklands by Special Licence by S E E Aylward, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Robert Greenshields and Isabella Morrison. George's father was recorded as Charles Henry Short, capitaz, and Christina's father was recorded as Finlay Morrison, deceased. George, age 73 & a retired farm manager, died in Stanley 9 May 1977 and was buried 11 May 1977 in Grave U1888.

Children of Frederick (1) (4) and Eliza SHORT:

1. **Marjorie Alice SHORT** born 22 August 1912 on Douglas Station. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Marjorie, age 16 & a nursemaid, went on holiday to England in 1928.

Children of James (2) (2) and Rose BIGGS:

1. **Frederick James BIGGS** born 14 July 1888 at Roy Cove to James and Rose Biggs and baptised 4 November 1888 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as carter. Frederick, age 26 and a private in the FI Volunteer Force, drowned 1 December 1914 and was buried Sunday 6 December 1914 in Grave A776.
2. **Alfred May BIGGS** born 29 October 1889. Alfred, a labourer, was married to **Mabel Isabella CLARKE** 13 June 1922 at the Office of the Registrar General, Stanley by Special Licence by M Craigie-Halkett, Registrar General. The witnesses were John Henry Archibald Clarke and Jane Lucasia Clarke. Mabel's father was George Henry Clarke, carter. Mabel died 18 July 1925 from pulmonary tuberculosis and is buried in Grave K924. Alfred died 28 August 1941, age 51, from post operative peritonitis, and is buried in Grave L1193.
3. **Lily Rosina BIGGS** born 16 November 1890. Lily was married to **Albert George SUMMERS**, shepherd, 18 April 1913 at the Registry Office, Stanley by Special Licence by M Craigie-Halkett, Registrar General. The witnesses were Ella Malvina

King and Alfred May Biggs. Albert's father was recorded as Edward Nathaniel Summers, shepherd. Lily died 27 January 1934 from broncho pneumonia and cardiac failure.

4. **Mable Eleanor BIGGS** born 15 September 1894. Mabel died 19 November 1895 from congestion of the lungs after influenza and was buried at Roy Cove.
5. **Bernard Nathaniel BIGGS** born 20 August 1896. Bernard died 30 August 1896 from congestion of the lungs and infantile convulsions (*no burial record*).

Children of Alfred (3) (1) and Hannah LEE:

1. **Ellen Mary Grace LEE** born 20 August 1892 on West Falkland and baptised 7 April 1893 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Ellen was married to (1) **William BLYTH**, labourer, 27 May 1913 in the Nonconformist Church (Tabernacle) by Special Licence by Robert Johnson, Nonconformist Minister. The witnesses were Alfred James Lee and Catherine Harriet Lee. Ellen's father was recorded as Alfred Vincent Lee, shepherd, and William's father was recorded as John Blyth, blacksmith. Ellen, a widow, was married to (2) **Thomas Nathaniel John BRAXTON**, navy, 10 June 1919 at Port Howard by Special Licence by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Henry John Lee and Flora Braxton. Ellen's father was recorded as Alfred Vincent Lee, shepherd, and Thomas' father was recorded as Thomas Braxton, deceased carpenter.
2. **Alfred Francis LEE** born 17 September 1894 at Port Howard and baptised 9 November 1894 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Alfred, a navy, was married to **Elsie Adelaide JOHNSON** 24 April 1923 at Port Howard, West Falkland by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were John Lee and G F Johnson. Alfred's father was recorded as Alfred Vincent Lee, shepherd, and Elsie's father was recorded as George Frederick Johnson, foreman.
