

TAYLOR FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Any variations which may occur in the spellings of names are recorded as written in the records at the time.

Thomas Charles Harper TAYLOR, a steward, and **Sarah Elizabeth Moss SUTHERLAND**, both of full age and living in Stanley, were married 26 May 1888 in the Service room according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were C Burnell and Emily Brocking. Thomas' father was recorded as William Hugh Taylor, livery stable keeper, and Sarah's as John Sutherland, fish curer. Thomas appears to have later changed his profession as he put an advertisement in the September 1890 local periodical "*Thomas C H Taylor, Stanley, undertakes painting in all its branches.*" [CM Sep 1890] A Mr & Mrs C Taylor and family are recorded as leaving the Falkland Islands 17 May 1895 on board the *Tanis* for Europe and this may have been Thomas as there does not appear to have been any other TAYLOR families in the Falkland Islands at that time. [CM Jun 1895]

FIRST GENERATION:

1. **Charles John Harper TAYLOR** born 2 April 1889 in Stanley and baptised 2 May 1889 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as painter.
2. **Beatrice Moss TAYLOR** born 4 September 1890 and baptised 9 October 1890 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as painter.
3. **William Hughes TAYLOR** born 23 December 1891 and baptised 17 January 1892 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as painter.
4. **Ronald TAYLOR** born 11 October 1893 in Stanley and baptised 5 November 1893 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as painter.
