COLONY OF THE FALKLAND ISLANDS

REPORT OF THE CENSUS TAKEN ON THE 16th NOVEMBER 1986

- 1. It was decided in August 1986 that a Census should be taken in the Falkland Islands on Sunday 16th November 1986.
- 2. The last Census was taken in December 1980. Although less than 8 years would have elapsed since then it was considered that so much had happened in the Falkland Islands in the intervening period that the Government needed to take stock for economic and other planning purposes.
- 3. The 1986 Census broke new ground in a number of ways, some of which were
 - (a) Material from the Census was processed on a computer;
 - (b) Residents temporarily overseas were counted;
 - (c) An explanatory booklet was prepared and distributed;
 - (d) Persons were encouraged to describe themselves under standard occupational categories;
 - (e) The household information section was revised to enable a better picture of energy needs to be obtained, to discover how good our means of fire fighting and how self-sufficient householders are in the supply of vegetables, poultry and eggs;
 - (2) Questions were asked to enable the Government to discover the general educational standard extant in the Falkland Islands.

As is usual, strict confidentiality was observed with regard to the content of returns. In spite of this a very small minority of persons required quite an amount of persuasion to return their completed Schedules. Most objections to giving information appeared to stem from misunderstandings concerning the intended use to which information contained in answers would be put. As it happened we achieved a full return of Schedules.

Serious consideration had to be given as to how to treat the comparatively large expatriate population consisting of persons serving with the Government and local companies, persons working on building contracts like the hospital and servicemen and persons working for the Ministry of Defence.

It was decided to count persons working in permanent government and other posts but not to count persons working on special contracts, servicemen or persons working for the Ministry of Defence. Houses occupied by such persons were included in the Census and information was provided concerning motor vehicles used by contractors and other organisations whose personnel were not included in the Census.

The Schedule which was approved by Executive Council was prepared after consultations with a number of officials and other interested persons. Material obtained from overseas was also drawn on. The Schedule was designed so as to make it easier to feed the information obtained into a computer. This was done using software purchased from the University of Kent. Some problems were experienced in using the software some of which have yet to be overcome.

It is to be hoped that at the next Census the Schedule can be so designed that the computer can be fed more quickly.

The tables attached in Part 1 of the Annex to this Report are those taken from the Computer at the date of this report. A much wider range of information can be extracted for statistical and other purposes if the need arises.

Opportunity has been taken to include the Census Form in Part 2 of the Annex and the Explanatory booklet in Part 3.

As in previous Reports a few items of interest are given as follows -

Oldest Residents:

There was a 91 year old man and a 91 year old woman.

Over 80's

There were 37 residents of 80 years and over in 1980 and 32 in 1986.

Birthplace:

67% of the population was born in the Falkland Islands. 25% of the population was born in the United Kingdom. 8% of the population was born elsewhere.

Nationality:

96% of the population is British, this compares with 95% in 1980.

Movement of Population:

The population of Stanley increased from 1050 in 1980 to 1232 in 1986. (58% of the population in 1980, 65% in 1986).

The population of Camp decreased from 763 in 1980 to 653 in 1986. (42% of the population in 1980, 35% in 1986).

Residents temporarily overseas:

There were 31 residents temporarily overseas. These persons are included in Table 1, but not in any other Table.

Employers:

The returns revealed that there are 90 employers in the Falkland Islands.

GENERAL NOTES

Introduction

These notes are intended to assist heads of households in the completion of their Census Schedule.

Each head of household is required by law to complete the Census Schedule fully and truthfully. The Census will provide information which will help planning for the future on the islands. Your co-operation is needed.

The Census covers the population in the Falkland Islands and temporarily overseas.

Schedule

There is one form in three parts to be completed by the head of household. These parts are —

- No. 1 Household members:
- No. 2 Household members temporarily living outside the Falkland Islands;
- No. 3 Dwelling information.

All three parts will need to be completed for ordinary dwelling houses and other places of residence.

Please see the notes on pages 4 to 6 to help you answer the different questions.

Please sign the declaration at the end of the form.

Households

A household means all those people living within the dwelling.

The head of each household is responsible for the information for his or her household and for returning the form to the enumerator.

In cases where the usual head of household is away on Census night, the "acting" head of household is to be treated as the head of household for the purposes of the Census.

If any one household has more than 5 members, a continuation sheet will be supplied. Please tell your enumerator in such cases when he or she calls with the forms.

Delivery of Schedules

Census night is the night of Sunday 16th November 1986. Before Census night you should have received a copy of these general notes or, if you are in Camp, will be able to see a copy. If you know of anyone who has not had a copy or is not able to see one please tell either that person or the enumerator so that he or she can get the notes.

Sometime before Census night either an enumerator will call on you to deliver the Schedule or it will be sent by post. If you do not receive enough Schedules please contact an enumerator without delay. The enumerators in Stanley will make known before Census night which of them or which of their assistants look after your district.

Confidentiality

Collection and Processing of Schedules

The information collected in this Census is CONFIDENTIAL and will be used ONLY FOR STATISTICAL PURPOSES. This means that the information will only be seen by those who need to see it in order to check the Schedules for ommissions and apparent errors and to compile the statistics.

The first checks will be carried out when your enumerator collects or receives your returns. He or she will examine them and may have to ask questions in order to help you complete the forms satisfactorily.

The returns will then pass to a central point for the first stages of statistical processing. Further checks will be made on each return to eliminate any obvious errors. In a few cases this may mean that the enumerator will have to call back on you to sort out some apparent mistake, but it is hoped this will not be necessary. Your care and co-operation will help to reduce the need for such "call-backs".

When all the Schedules have been checked, a preliminary census report will be published. The Schedules will then be sent to London for further processing.

FILLING IN THE SCHEDULE

The three parts of the Schedule are mostly designed so that you can simply enter a cross or tick in a box representing the right answer. Most questions are easy to answer. The following notes only deal with things that may need a little explanation.

PART 1 — HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS

General:

In column (a) write the name of every person in a household on Census night, including visitors.

Columns (b) to (l) contain information about each person named in column (a).

If in doubt about the information to put about any individual please check with that person.

Question (b) - Relationship to Head of Household

The answer to this question should be one of the following -

Head, spouse, child, brother, sister, nephew, niece, grandchild, parent, parent-in-law, boarder, servant, visitor, other.

This question is asked in order to get statistics on household composition which will help in working out social policies. The answers are thus intended more to find out the role of a person in the household rather than who is related to whom.

Spouse will usually mean the wife or husband of the head of household. However, if a couple (including the head) who are not legally married regard themselves as living together permanently as man and wife the partner of the head of household should be entered as "spouse". This is a matter of choice and agreement for such couples.

Child includes step-children and adopted children being brought up in the household as the child of the head. However, nephews/nieces and grandchildren should be entered as such.

Question (e) — Married, Single, Widowed, Separated, Divorced

Separated means that you are legally married but are living apart from your legal spouse and not intending to reunite. Do not enter anyone who is "separated" as "married".

On the other hand, someone whose spouse is temporarily absent but expected to return is "married" not "separated".

Please enter your correct marital status. It will not be regarded as inconsistent to enter someone as "spouse" under question (b) but as single, widowed, separated or divorced under question (e).

Question (h) — Occupation

This question is not required to be answered by persons under 15 years of age.

The answer to question (h) should give one or more of the employments listed in the attached list headed "Occupations". If a person has more than one occupation they should put them.

People are self-employed if most of their income comes from work they do on their own account (eg. as a tradesman or businessman).

Question (i) — Employer

Put name of person or organisation for whom you are working (eg. the Government, Falkland Islands Company, self-employed).

Question (j) - Examinations passed

Enter in left hand box the number of examinations passed (eg. 6 C.S.E.).

In other put diploma or training acquired (eg. Diploma Hotel Management, S.R.N.).

PART 2 — HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS TEMPORARILY LIVING OUTSIDE THE FALKLAND ISLANDS

This question is intended to find out those persons who are overseas with a clear intention of returning. They will normally be persons undertaking any one of the following —

Further schooling, university training, practical training (eg. temporary work on a farm), secretarial training.

Question (d)

This question is intended to reveal means of transport used personally by members of a household. Motor vehicles belonging to an employer should not be included in answers unless used outside working hours.

The facilities used by members of the household if kept in the household should be included even if hired or owned by an employer.

Radios mean those used for communication purposes and not used for listening to public broadcasts.

Radios or 2 metre Sets should be included although permanently kept in a motor vehicle.
