


























# PROGRAMME of EVENTS

on the occasion of the visit to the

FALKLAND ISLANDS

The Duke of Edinburgh

MONDAY, TUESDAY & WEDNESDAY, 7th, 8th & 9th January, 1957.

#### MONDAY, 7th JANUARY, 1957.

- 9.00 a.m. Her Majesty's Yacht "Britannia" will anchor in Stanley Harbour when the Falkland Islands Defence Force will fire a 21 gun salute.
- 2. 9.30 a.m. His Royal Highness will land at the Public Jetty where Members of Executive Council, Legislative Council, the Heads of Churches and wives will be presented. His Royal Highness will then inspect the Guard of Honour mounted by the Royal Navy, Royal Marines and the Falkland Islands Defence Force.
- 3. 9.42 a.m. His Royal Highness will walk along Ross Road, passing the Boys' Brigade and Girls' Life Brigade who will be on parade and then through the ranks of school children, with the public standing behind them, to the corner of Dean Street at Arch Green, where he will enter his car and drive to Government House.

Ross Road between the Public Jetty and Government House will be closed to traffic between 9.00 and 10.00 a.m.

4. 10.11 a.m. His Royal Highness will drive to the Town Hall.

Ross Road between Government House and Villiers Street closed to traffic between 10.00 and 10.35 a.m.

- 5. 10.13 a.m. His Royal Highness arrives at the Town Hall (south entrance) and proceeds to the Council Chamber which he will enter at 10.15 a.m. The Senior Elected Member of Legislative Council (The Hon. Mr. A. L. Hardy, B.E.M., J.P.) will read an Address of Welcome to which His Royal Highness will reply. The Address and Reply will be relayed to the public outside the Town Hall. Admission to the Council Chamber will be by invitation.
- 6. 10.25 a.m. His Royal Highness will leave the Town Hall and return to Government House.
- 7. 11.20 a.m. His Royal Highness will leave Government House

and drive to the Race-course. The Chairman of the Stanley Sports Association will present members of the Joint Sports Committee and wives. His Royal Highness will then enter the enclosure of the stand on the southern side. Admission to the southern enclosure and stand will be by invitation.

Ross Road between Government House and the Race-course will be closed to traffic between 11.05 a.m. and 11.30 a.m.

- 8. 11.30 a.m. His Royal Highness will watch the following races held over from the joint Stanley, Darwin Harbour and West Sports Associations' Sports Meeting which will take place on the 4th and 5th January:-
  - (i) Darwin Harbour Plate for imported horses, 800 yards.
  - (ii) Pony Race, Open, 300 yards.
  - (iii) West Falkland Plate, Falkland Islands Bred, 600 yards.
  - (iv) Sailors' Race, for horses not having taken a first prize at the meeting, 300 yards.
  - (v) Governor's Cup, Open, 700 yards.
- 9. 12.40 p.m. His Royal Highness will return to Government House.

Ross Road between the Race-course and Government House will be closed to traffic between 12.30 and 12.50 p.m.

- 10. 1.00 p.m. Luncheon at Government House to be attended by invited guests.
- 2.30 p.m. His Royal Highness will leave Government House and drive to the King Edward Memorial Hospital.

Ross Road between Government House and Dean Street closed to traffic between 2.15 and 3.10 p.m. Reservoir Road north of the junction with St. Mary's Walk closed to traffic between 2.15 and 3.50 p.m. Villiers Street closed to traffic between 2.40 and 3.10 p.m.

- 12. 2.32 p.m. His Royal Highness will arrive at the King Edward Memorial Hospital and be met by the Senior Medical Officer. Members of the staff will be presented to His Royal Highness who will walk through the wards.
- 13. 2.47 p.m. His Royal Highness will leave the Hospital and drive to the Infants' School, via Reservoir Road, Ross Road and Villiers Street.

- 14. 2.49 p.m. His Royal Highness will arrive at the Infants' School and be met by the Superintendent of Education and the Senior Mistress of the Infants' School at the east entrance. Children from the Senior School will be asked to line up in the playground in charge of their class teachers and the infants will be seated at their desks. His Royal Highness will then inspect the School.
- 15. 3.04 p.m. His Royal Highness will leave the Infants' School and drive to Sappers Hill, via Villiers Street, Ross Road and Reservoir Road.
- 16. 3.10 p.m. His Royal Highness will arrive at Sappers Hill and watch an exhibition of peat cutting near the water tank. He will then return to the Rifle Range and see the last few minutes of a shoot organised between a team from the Royal Navy or Royal Marines and a Falkland Islands team. The local team will be presented.

Reservoir Road south of St. Mary's Walk closed to traffic between 3.00 and 3.50 p.m. Sappers Hill Road from the water tank to the junction with Reservoir Road closed to traffic between 3.00 and 3.50 p.m.

- 17. 3.40 p.m. His Royal Highness returns from Sappers Hill to Government House.
- 18. 4.45 p.m. His Royal Highness will drive from Government House to the Gymnasium to see an exhibition of sheep, fleeces and horse-gear organised by the Sheepowners' Association and an exhibition of work, including spinning and weaving, arranged by the Spinners, Weavers and Dyers Guild.

Ross Road between Government House and Villiers Street closed to traffic between 4.40 and 4.55 p.m. (the Exhibition will be open to the general public between 2.00 p.m. and 3.00 p.m. on Tuesday, 8th January.)

19. 5.47 p.m. His Royal Highness will leave the Gymnasium and drive to Arch Green where the Chairman and Members of the Town Council and wives will be presented. His Royal Highness will plant a tree at Arch Green to commemorate his visit to the Colony.

Ross Road between Barrack Street and Philomel Street closed to traffic between 5.40 and 6.10 p.m.

- 20. 5.56 p.m. His Royal Highness will walk from Arch Green to the Cathedral. The Senior Chaplain will escort His Royal Highness through the Cathedral.
- 21. 6.02 p.m. His Royal Highness will leave the Cathedral and walk to the Public Jetty where he will embark in the Royal Barge and return to Her Majesty's Yacht "Britannia".
- 22. 8.00 p.m. His Royal Highness will give a dinner party on board the Royal Yacht to invited guests.
- 23. 10.13 p.m. His Royal Highness will arrive at the Public Jetty and drive to the Town Hall.

Ross Road between Philomel Street and Government House closed to traffic between 9.45 and 10.20 p.m. Ross Road between Villiers Street and Government House closed to traffic between 10.35 and 10.55 p.m.

- 24. 10.15 p.m. His Royal Highness will arrive at the Town Hall and be met at the entrance by the Chairman of the Town Council and his wife. As His Royal Highness reaches the top of the steps leading down to the ballroom the National Anthem will be played. His Royal Highness will then proceed to the stage where Members of Executive Council, the Legislative Council, the Town Council and the Committees of the Sheepowners' Association, the joint Sports Associations and wives will be standing.
  - His Royal Highness will then present trophies to the winners of some of the major events at the joint Sports Meeting and to the prize winners of the five races held during the morning.

The doors of the Town Hall will be closed between 9.55 p.m. and the departure of His Royal Highness at 10.45 p.m. Dancing will then begin.

25. 10.45 p.m. His Royal Highness will return to Government House.

#### TUESDAY, 8th JANUARY, 1957.

26. 9.30 a.m. His Royal Highness will leave Government House for the Public Jetty.

Ross Road between Government House and Philomel Street closed to traffic between 9.20 and 9.40 a.m.

- 9.33 a.m. His Royal Highness will arrive at the Public Jetty and embark in the "Alert" for the Beaver Aircraft moored nearby.
- 28. 9.35 a.m. His Royal Highness will fly for 70 minutes over the "Great Britain", Port Louis, Darwin School, Goose Green, Fitzroy and then return to Stanley.
- 29. 10.45 a.m. His Royal Highness will return to the Public Jetty and drive to Government House.

Ross Road between Philomel Street and Government House closed to traffic between 10.40 and 11.00 a.m.

30. 11.15 a.m. His Royal Highness will drive to the Race-course where he will watch an exhibition by three working sheep dogs. The dogs running will be those filling the first, second and third places in the open championship held on Sunday, 6th January.

Twelve minutes will be allowed for each event with intervals of three minutes.

Ross Road between Government House and the Race-course will be closed to traffic between 11.00 and 11.25 a.m. and between 11.55 a.m. and 12.15 p.m.

Vehicles going to the Race-course before 11.00 a.m. should proceed via St. Mary's Walk and Reservoir Road.

31. 12.05 p.m. His Royal Highness will leave the Race-course for the Meteorological Station driving via Ross Road, Philomel Street North, Crozier Place, Hebe Street, and Davis Street.

These roads will be closed to traffic between 11.55 a.m. and 12.15 p.m. and between 12.35 and 1.00 p.m.

32. 12.12 p.m. His Royal Highness will arrive at the Meteorological

Station and be met by the Chief Meteorological Officer. He will inspect the Meteorological Station and Radio Sonde Station and see a weather balloon ascent.

- 33. 12.42 p.m. His Royal Highness will return from the Meteorological Station to Government House taking the same route in reverse.
- 34. 1.15 p.m. Luncheon at Government House to be attended by invited guests.
- 35. 5.35 p.m. His Royal Highness will drive from Government House to the Public Jetty.

Ross Road between Government House and Philomel Street closed to traffic between 5.25 and 5.45 p.m.

- 36. 5.38 p.m. His Royal Highness will arrive at the Public Jetty.
- 37. 5.40 p.m. His Royal Highness will embark in the Royal Barge and go out to Her Majesty's Yacht "Britannia".
- 38. 7.15 to His Royal Highness will give a reception on board 9.00 p.m. Her Majesty's Yacht "Britannia" for invited guests.
- 39. 11.00 p.m. Her Majesty's Yacht "Britannia" will sail for Fox Bay.

- 40. 8.30 a.m. Her Majesty's Yacht "Britannia" will anchor off Fox Bay.
- 41. 9.30 a.m. His Royal Highness will land at Fox Bay East, where he will be met by the Manager and his wife. After presentations a tour of the Settlement will be made while drafting is in progress. The Government Wireless Station will be visited.
- 42. 10.45 a.m. Refreshments at the Manager's house.
- 43. 11.30 a.m. His Royal Highness will visit the woolshed to see shearing and baling.
- 44. 12.15 p.m. His Royal Highness will embark in the Royal Barge for Her Majesty's Yacht "Britannia".
- 45. 12.45 p.m. Luncheon on board Her Majesty's Yacht "Britannia" for invited guests.
- 46. 2.00 p.m. Luncheon guests will come ashore when Her Majesty's Yacht "Britannia" sails for South Georgia.
