No. 6. Confidential. I have it in command from His Majesty the King to convey to you the following message for announcement in the Colony on the 11th or 12th of February. Message begins "I have been greatly interested to hear of coming Centenary Celebrations in the Falkland Islands, and I take the opportunity of requesting you to convey to the people of the Colony my earnest good wishes for their happiness and welfare. I shall always follow with affectionate solicitude the fortunes of a colony whose people, though separated from the mother country by wide tracts of ocean are nevertheless bound to it by the closest ties of kinship and loyalty fullstop George R.I. 
