RULES Public Library and Museum. LIBRARY.

*Officiating Chairman of
the Committee.
21st May 1919.*

1. [1] The Library shall be open, admission free, on such days, and at such hours as the Library and Museum Committee may from time to time fix.

[2] No child under the age of 13 years shall, without the special permission of the Librarian, be admitted to the Library except to borrow and take out a book or magazine, under Rule 10, on such days and at such hours as the Committee may from time to time fix.

2. [1] Any resident may, on application, and on prepayment to the Librarian of a yearly subscription of five shillings (5/-), or half-yearly of three shillings (3/-), borrow and take out one book (two volumes) at a time.

[2] If sufficient numbers of copies are subscribed for, any resident paying a yearly subscription of two pounds (£2), or half-yearly of one pound five shillings (£1 : 5 : 0) may take out one monthly magazine, and one weekly or daily newspaper in addition to three books (two volumes each) at a time.

3. Any resident not being a subscriber as above may borrow and take out one book at a time on prepayment to the Librarian of two pence (2d.) per week.

4. No book shall be retained for a longer period than two weeks. If at the end of that period and on return of the book to the Library, the book has not been asked for by another subscriber, the book may be taken out again by the same subscriber for a further period of one week.

5. No monthly magazine taken out shall be retained for a longer period than one week.

6. Daily or weekly newspapers shall only be taken out at the last hour of closing of the Library for the day, and shall be returned at the first hour fixed for the next opening of the Library.

7. No book, monthly magazine or newspaper shall be lent or passed on by one person to another.

8. Any person who shall fail to return any book, monthly magazine or newspaper to the Librarian, as required by these Rules, shall pay a fine of 2d. a day for each day every book, monthly magazine or newspaper is not so returned.

9. No talking to the annoyance of any person shall be allowed in the Library. Any person on being cautioned by the Librarian and persisting in the same shall be guilty of an offence under these Rules.

Children's Section of Library.

10. Any child under the age of 13 years, on prepayment of an annual subscription of one shilling (1/-) and on application to the Librarian, may borrow and take out one book or one magazine at a time from the Children's Section. Any book or magazine taken out shall be returned to the Librarian within one week.

MUSEUM.

11. [1] The Museum shall be open, admission free, on such days, and at such hours, as the Committee may from time to time fix.

[2] No child under the age of 13 years shall be admitted to the Museum unless accompanied by and in charge of a responsible person.

[3] When the Mail Steamer is in harbour the Museum shall be open as the Committee may direct.

[4] Any person desirous of making a special visit to the Museum may apply to the Librarian and Museum Attendant.

[5] No Visitor shall be allowed to touch or handle any exhibit in the Museum.

GENERAL.

12. The loss or damage of any book, monthly magazine, newspaper, or of any article either in the Library or the Museum, shall be reported and payment to the value thereof made to the Librarian and Museum Attendant.

13. No smoking shall be allowed either in the Library or Museum. No dogs shall be allowed on the premises.


14. Any person infringing any of these rules shall be liable to a penalty of twenty shillings.

15. These Rules may be cited as the Library and Museum Rules, 1919.

16. The Rules made on the 22nd April, 1919, are hereby cancelled.

RULES
Public Library and Museum.

LIBRARY.

1. The Library shall be open, admission free, :—
On Sunday, Wednesday, and Saturday from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.
On Monday from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m.
On Tuesday from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.
On Friday from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m.
2. (1) Any resident may, on application, and on prepayment to the Librarian of a yearly subscription of five shillings (5/-), or half-yearly of three shillings (3/-), borrow and take out one book (two volumes) at a time,
(2) If sufficient number of copies are subscribed for, any resident paying a yearly subscription of two pounds (£2), or half-yearly of one pound five shillings (£1 : 5 : 0) may take out one monthly magazine, and one weekly or daily newspaper in addition to three books (two volumes each) at a time.
3. Any resident not being a subscriber as above may borrow and take out one book at a time on prepayment to the Librarian of two pence (2d.) per week.
4. No book shall be retained for a longer period than two weeks. If at the end of that period and on return of the book to the Library, the book has not been asked for by another subscriber, the book may be taken out again by the same subscriber for a further period of one week.

8. Any person who shall fail to return any book, monthly magazine or newspaper to the Librarian, as required by these Rules, shall pay a fine of 2d. a day for each day every book, monthly magazine or newspaper is not so returned.
9. No talking to the annoyance of any person shall be allowed in the Library. Any person on being cautioned by the Librarian and persisting in the same shall be guilty of an offence under these Rules.

Children's Section of Library.

10. Any child under the age of 15 years, on prepayment of an annual subscription one shilling (1/-) and on application to the Librarian, may borrow and take out one book or one magazine at a time from the Children's Section. Any book so taken out shall be returned to the Librarian within one week.

MUSEUM.

11. The Museum shall be open, admission free, :—
On Tuesday and Friday from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.
On Saturday and Sunday from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.

When the Mail Steamer is in harbour the Museum shall also be open from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Any person desirous of visiting the Museum at any other time of the day may apply to the Librarian and Museum Attendant for special permission.

GENERAL.

12. The loss or damage of any book, monthly magazine, newspaper, or of any article either in the Library or the Museum, shall be reported and payment to the value thereof made to the Librarian and Museum Attendant.

13. No smoking shall be allowed either in the Library or Museum.

14. Any person infringing any of these rules shall be liable to a penalty of twenty shillings.
