We discussed and I explained my view that Mr. Bradley's letter binds Government, morally if not legally, to give £300 to the Town Council, as successor to the Library Committee, for the purpose of buying books. On the other hand I do not think that there is any claim to interest on the £300, nor do I think that the T.C. should concern itself with the manner in which the money is invested. They can have the £300, or any part thereof, to settle bills for books as soon as they produce the bills. On second thoughts I do not think we should restrict them to £100 a year for three years. As soon as there is good accommodation for the Library, there is a good case for building it up as soon as possible into as good a library as we can make it.

At a meeting of the Library Committee the opinion was unanimously supported that the Public Library being a service of the highest importance to the public should be re-opened with the least possible delay, particularly in view of the fact that it is now winter and that recreation for the people of Stanley has been severely curtailed by the loss of the Town Hall. Various measures were considered with regard to a temporary Library and by far the most satisfactory, it was agreed, would be to rent the Kelvin Store which is now vacant for occupation, is in good structural condition, contains a considerable range of shelving and is in an excellent central position. The rental asked is £24 per annum and the Committee would now beg to submit for the consideration of His Excellency a request that an increase of £24 be made to their annual grant in order that this excellent opportunity of continuing the work of the Public Library may be adopted. The Committee would express the hope that His Excellency will be pleased to regard the application in a favourable light.

It should be added that thanks to the generosity of many public spirited people at least 500 volumes have been given to form the nucleus of the new Library and that the Officer Commanding the Falkland Islands

Force will make another substantial loan as soon as accomodation is available.

AGREEMENT.

THIS AGREEMENT made the 26th day of June, 1944, between Duncan Russell Watson of Stanley hereinafter called "landlord" of the one part and the Public Library and Museum Committee of Stanley hereinafter called "tenant" on the other part.

WITNESSETH THAT the landlord agrees to let and the tenant agree to take and rent all that shop known as the Kelvin Store situate on the South-East corner of the crossing of John Street and Dean Street in the Town of Stanley together with all fixtures and fittings therein.

TO HOLD for the term of one year commencing from this day at the rent of two pounds per calendar month payable in arrears.

AND THAT at the termination of the year of tenancy this agreement may be renewed for the further term of one year or may be terminated by the giving of three month's notice by either landlord or tenant.

AND THAT if the agreement is renewed for a second term of one year the said conditions as to renewal or notice shall apply at the end of the second year of tenancy and every subsequent year;

AND THAT the landlord agrees to keep all the walls, roofs and outside parts of the said shop in substantial repair.

AND THAT the tenant agrees to keep the interior of the said shop and all fixtures and fittings in good order and repair.

AND THAT the tenant may make such alteration in the fittings and fixtures and in the arrangement of the supply of electricity are necessary to his purpose and may paint or varnish the int as he considers to be requisite.

The following is submitted in the hope that favourable consideration may be given to this scheme for improving the Public Service of the Library, and that a grant of £250 may be made for this purpose.

At a recent meeting of the Library Committee it was decided that the present Library is unsuitable for the following reasons (a) Building too cold (b) Mr. Watson intends to increase the rent to £36 per year (c) Accommodation is inadequate. Books are at present arranged in double rows on shelves. The question was discussed whether a nissen hut could be converted into a suitable library. Colonel Woodgate, who had been invited to attend the meeting to advise the Committee, expressed the opinion that at least five years would elapse before a new library could be built and a nissen hut could be erected and fitted up to fill the need for that length of time for £200. He thought heating apparatus could be procured easily from the disused Camp. It is thought that the bookshelves of the Army Library may still be standing and could be used. It was decided to approach the Falkland Islands Co. regarding a site but as is well known this question does not now arise.

Having regard to the great importance of the Library from the educational aspect the Committee wishes to suggest that this proposal may be given special consideration.

2. With the inclusion of central heating the final estimate for the erection for this proposed Nissen hut is £361. His Excellency regrets that he does not consider such a heavy expenditure justified and thinks that there is no alternative but to pay the increased rent for the present building. The Executive Engineer advises that extra shelving can be installed in order to relieve the congestion and this has been approved.

(1) Furnishing and equipment of a library. In 1943, while in use by an Army Concert Party, the Town Hall was completely destroyed by fire and with it the library and museum which were incorporated in the same building. Although the hall itself was insured, the policy had been effected on the original cost of construction which, of course, falls far below the replacement figure. I hope to embark on a new building next year and to include within it a library and adults' and children's reading rooms. It would be of great practical assistance to this small and relatively poor community if the Council would undertake to furnish the library and reading rooms.

Many thanks for your letter of 12th February; it only arrived the other day which indicates the remoteness of your kingdom.

Unfortunately, it arrived at a very bad time. Our Treasury grant for the coming year bears no relation to the new activities into which we have been pressed, e.g. Europe, South East Asia, etc., and the unallocated reserve, out of which we used to finance sundry smaller items in the course of the year, is microscopically small.

To deal with your three suggestions:-

1. Furnishing and equipment of a library. This, of course, is very much up our street, and I should very much like to help. Whether it might be possible this year if required depends on whether we can achieve any savings in other directions. As, however, I gather you still have to build the library, next year might be soon enough for the furnishing and equipment.

Any new departure of this sort, that is to say in a new territory, will require Colonial Office approval and they may even wish to refer it to the Treasury. I would suggest that you might write to the Colonial Office saying that it seems to you that the furnishing and equipment of your library might be a suitable objective for Council assistance, and giving some estimate of the local cost. We can, of course, deal with the estimate for books. We could then get down to it with the Colonial Office either this year or next, as the case may be.

I have the honour to refer to my despatch No. 37 of 26th September, 1947, enclosing an application for a free grant not exceeding £15,500 from the Colonial Development and Welfare Fund towards the cost of the construction of a new Town Hall for Stanley, and to seek your assistance in obtaining the help of the British Council or other body in furnishing and equipping the Public Library and reading room for which provision is made in the plans of the building.

2. I need scarcely emphasise the great practical assistance which this small and relatively poor community would derive in this way, and I do not expect that the cost of furnishing the rooms would exceed £1,000. The British Council would of course be in a position to deal with the estimate for books: and I have reason to believe that the project would commend itself sympathetically to its governing body.

3. I take this opportunity to enquire when I may expect to receive a reply to my despatch under reference.
