The circumstances regarding the removal of this hulk from Stanley to New Island are,I think, recorded in the C.S.O.

Sir,

I beg to report that while at New Island, West Falkland, on Saturday the 29th April last, I observed that the Hulk "Glengowan" was not at her usual moorings at the New Island Whaling Station, but that she was ashore on a small island at the entrance of Ship Harbour (New Island). The hulk I was given to understand by Mr.Scott New Island, had broken adrift during the heavy southebly gale on Wednesday the 26th April last.

The "Glengowan" where she now lies is not a danger to navigation, nor is she in any danger of breaking up. It would of course be possible to tow her back, if so desired, to her former moorings at New Island.
