Sir,


I beg to inform you that there is at Darwin a Mrs Johnson who has been ill there for some time and is seriously in need of proper nursing. Our M.O. at Darwin has informed me that he does not consider the case as incurable and thinks that proper nursing in Hospital, which is not possible in the Camp, should restore her to better health.

2. I understand that the Colonial Surgeon is agreeable to Mrs Johnson entering the Hospital, and I shall be obliged if His Excellency the Acting Governor would allow H.M.C.S. "Afterglow", when returning to Stanley south about to call in at Walker Creek and bring the patient in, as we have no vessel calling at Darwin until the middle of December. If His Excellency would allow this we should be glad if we could receive a few days notice of the date on which the "Afterglow" would be calling at Walker Creek so that we could make arrangements for getting the patient there from Darwin.
