INSTRUCTIONS TO MASTERS †

A Record of every birth of a child or death of a person ON BOARD ship is required to be made by the Master of every British ship (excepting Dominion or Colonial ships within the jurisdiction of the Government of the British Possession to which they belong) and of every Foreign ship carrying passengers to or from the United Kingdom.

A Return of the facts recorded is to be delivered to a Superintendent, Consul or other Officer abroad, at the earliest opportunity.

Failure to comply with these requirements renders the Master liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds for each offence. (Sections 254 and 339, Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.)

*NOTE: When the death of a person at sea is assumed by the Master to have taken place because the person in question is reported to be missing, or where a person is killed or drowned as a result of falling or jumping overboard, falling from a rope or ladder attached to the ship, or from the ship's gangway, the death should be regarded as having taken place ON BOARD. Deaths which neither occur on board nor come within these qualifications, should not be recorded in this Return but on Form B. & D. 2.

INSTRUCTIONS TO SUPERINTENDENTS, CONSULS AND OTHER OFFICERS ABROAD

It is important that the Officer receiving this Return should be satisfied as to its accuracy before completing the certificate on pages 2 and 3, and before forwarding it to the Registrar General of Shipping and Seamen he should endorse the Ship's Agreement that he has received it.

If any Master fails to deliver this Return at the first opportunity after the occurence of a birth or death on board his ship the fact should be endorsed on the Ship's Agreement and reported to the Registrar General of Shipping and Seamen.

Deaths of Merchant Seamen and Fishermen which do not occur on board (see Note above) should be recorded on Form B. & D. 2.

A Report should also be forwarded on Form B. & D. 3., 4. or 5. in every case of death which comes to the notice of a Consul or other Officer abroad. If for any reason such report cannot be made, the Registrar General of Shipping and Seamen should be informed.





SEAMEN'S CERTIFICATE OF NATIONALITY AND IDENTITY, REGULATIONS.

- (1) Certificates of Nationality and Identity are issued by command of the Officers Administering the Governments of the respective Colonial and oversea territories.
- (2) Application forms may be obtained from either:—
 - (a) The appropriate Authority in the Colonial or oversea territory.
 - (b) A British Consul in a foreign port; or
 - (c) An Immigration Officer in the United Kingdom.
- (3) Certificates are valid for five years in the first instance but may be extended for a further period of five years on application. Application for revalidation should be made to any of the Authorities mentioned in Regulation (2) or a United Kingdom Authority in a Commonwealth country at least three months before the date of expiration of the Certificate.
- (4) On issue of a Certificate or for revalidation a fee of 2/6d, is payable.

Caution.

This Certificate remains the property of the Government by which it is issued and may be withdrawn at any time. It is a valuable document; it should not be altered in any way or allowed to pass into the possession of an unauthorised person. Reference should be made to any of the Authorities mentioned in Regulation (2) above in any of the following circumstances, namely if this Certificate needs alteration; if it becomes damaged; if lost or destroyed.

Should you lose this book otherwise than by wreck you will not obtain a new one until your next discharge, and a fee will be chargeable; but you may obtain at once by applying to the Shipping Master, Stanley, Falkland Islands, and forwarding the office fee, an extract from Agreements and Official Log books of the vessels in which you served, showing service and character.

NOTE.—Should this Certificate come into the possession of any person to whom it does not belong, it should be handed to the Superintendent of the nearest Mercantile Marine Office, or be transmitted to the Shipping Master, Stanley, Falkland Islands, postage unpaid.


