I have the honour to confirm herewith my wireless message dated the 26th instant, which read as follows:-

"John Hamilton British Subject intends "purchasing German schooner "Fuerland" 36 tons "located at Magallanes from Captain Pluschow "-stop- He desires to obtain British Registry at "Port Stanley or Fox Bay -stop- As no British "Master available here could I issue provisional "Certificate of Registry and permit foreign Master "to take her to Falkland Islands please telegraph "reply. - British Consul.".

- 2. I should explain that it is absolutely impossible to obtain the services of a British Master in Magallanes and consequently I presume that under the circumstances there would be no objection to a foreign Master taking the "Fuerland" to the Falkland Islands.
- 3. Moreover, as the ship is only of 36 tons I presume that it is not necessary for her to open a set of Articles here as the crew would only amount to about three persons in addition to the Master.


