I have been nervous for some time regarding possible dangers to children who will use the jetties as a playground, and have considered the advisability of closing them as is suggested by Comd. Almeder. As you rightly point out the difficulty of enforcing the restriction would be great, particularly at the isolated Govt. Ho. and Sulvan Ho. jetties. Then again I have been influenced by the fact that these jetties are used a great deal by boys when fishing and to close them would therefore affect a useful recreation.

2. The provision of life buoys and ropes will be a useful precautionary measure, and Harbour should proceed as you propose, and submit an Indent for 6 life buoys.

According to the Price List of the Army & Navy Stores under "Yacht Fittings" cork life buoys are priced at $11/6$ for the 18 inch size to $15/6$ for the 30 inch size; the latter is stated to be the Broad of Head size. Harbour Master ought to have no difficulty in getting information as to the possible price of these articles; no doubt Colonial Engineer has catalogues of marine outfitting firms.
