This is the only site on the Jetty to which I can agree.

having been granted to two persons,
neither is there now any copies of
correspondence from Mr. V. Summers.
I submit that much of the officials
time is being wasted in circulating
incomplete minute papers, also it is
impossible to give a correct reply if
the full facts are not stated.
There is at the present time one set
of davits on the Public Jetty, and I

can only recommend the erection of one more set, making two in all. As previously stated, the position of the second set should be to the south of the existing ones, the foot of the davits to be let into the solid stonework, so as to relieve the wooden structure of the weight, this is the only site on the jibby to which I can agree. As the competent authority on the safety of the structure, and as this Department is responsible for the maintenance of the jibby. I am definitely opposed to permission being granted for 5 sets of davits being erected.

I beg to submit herewith a copy of an application received from the Stanley Sea Rover Scouts to erect davits at Sullivan Jetty.

2. In view of a petrol and oil store being maintained at this Jetty by the Public Works Department I do not consider it desirable that the application should be granted. Furthermore the structure of the jetty cannot be considered to be sufficiently strong to stand the stress of hauling up the Sea Rovers boat. I would add that I have consulted the Hon. Director of Public Works in this matter and he concurs with the views herein expressed.

3. I have no objection to offer to the davits being erected at the Public Jetty on similar conditions to those imposed when like concessions have been granted in the past.
