I beg most respectfully to inform you that Mr. Evans Assistant Keeper and myself have been under medical treatment for some time past and we are both still having medical treatment from Doctor Hallows, but at the same time Doctor Hallows informs me that he has received no instructions as to giving medicine or advice to the Lightkeepers. I should therefore feel very thankful if His Excellency, the Governor, would kindly instruct Doctor Hallows as to giving medicine and advice to the Lightkeepers. It may not be out of place for me to state that we have a free doctor in our agreement with the Board of Trade and also that the Board of Trade pay a certain sum of money per year for medical attendance which includes Wives and Families, but not free in case of child birth.
