

In order to facilitate the arrangements and the carrying out of the procedure necessary in connection with the receiving of vessels from overseas, I have the honour to request that you will be so good as to keep the Harbour Master informed regarding the movements of any vessels of which you may have information, when they are approaching the Colony. If you will be so kind as to inform him by telephone of the expected day and hour of arrival of such vessels at Stanley, it will be of great assistance to him in communicating with the Keeper at Cape Pembroke Lighthouse regarding the watch to be kept.

Please note that in future the procedure with regard to ~~MINUTE~~ the reporting of vessels approaching the port will be as follows:

1. You will be informed by the Falkland Islands Company of the movements of mailboats, whalers, or any other vessels of which they are the agents as to the day and hour of their expected arrival. In the case of His Majesty's ships or other vessels of which the Government may have information, you will be informed from this office. This information should be immediately communicated to the Keeper at Cape Pembroke Lighthouse, and will serve as his instructions regarding the watch to be kept.
2. On the near approach of any vessel the Lighthouse will communicate with the Exchange and the information will be transmitted to you through this centre.


