Sir,


I am directed by the Governor to inform you that a few years ago a Government boat was sent to the Sea Lion Islands for use in the work of the proposed erection of a light on the Island, and was left there pending the completion of the work.

2. His Excellency is informed that the boat has been used by the tenant of the Falkland Islands Company at Sea Lion Island, and that the boat is now at North Arm.

3. I am to say that the Governor will feel obliged if you will kindly arrange for the s.s. "Falkland" to bring the boat back to Stanley on her next trip to North Arm, should the boat be there, or, if not, to bring the boat back from Sea Lion Island if she is still there.
