Draft Customs Rules, respecting Overtime Fees.

C.S.577/16.

I respectfully beg to bring the fellowing to the notice of the Governor:-

- 2. It has been said that Customs Officers are paid in respect of "Overtime" in this Colony, higher fees than those paid to another Official in a senior position, that of the Harbour Master and Government Pilot.
- 3. As I understand it, Overtime is paid in respect of Extra services rendered.
- 4. The Harbour Master, as Government Pilet receives a fee of One pound or Twelve and six pence per day or part of a day, from Shipping, should his services be required for the convenience of shipping, beyond a stated time. This fee paid by Shipping under Sections 14 & 15 of the Pilet Ordinance, 1902, and refunded to the Pilet, is not described as Overtime, as in the case of such services rendered by the Custems Department.
- 5. I would further respectfully point out that should the services of the Harbour Master be required by the Government beyond a stated period, the Harbour Master is entitled to

claim from

claim from Government "Overtime Pay", whereas in the case of an Officer of Customs, the latter is not paid Overtime time by the Government in this Colony. The Overtime Pay received in this Colony by the Customs is entirely paid by Shipping.
