



Sir,

Our Agents in the Falkland Islands, the Estate Louis Williams, the Manager of which is Mr. E.G. Rowe, have requested us to place before you certain particulars in regard to business they allege has been done by the new steamer of the Falkland Islands Co., the s.s. "LAFONIA".

We have been informed that when the new vessel was built it was agreed with the Government that she should be equipped with a Bar for the sale of refreshments on board. In consequence, as soon as the vessel arrived at Port Stanley, Captain Roberts applied for a "Packet License," which was granted to This License authorised him to sell liquor to him. any passenger on board such vessel during her actual passage between the said places. It would appear, however, that The Falkland Islands Co., seem to have thought that they could just do as they pleased and stretch the License to suit their convenience, and it is alleged that for the past six months they have been selling Beer, Whisky etc., to anyon in the Islands who cared to come on board the "LAFONIA" and order same.

It is stated that they first of all started selling whole cases of Beer, which they brought down from Montevideo and just odd bottles of Spirits, but the last trip before the 19th June last, they took out with them a complete supply of cases of Whisky, Beer, Rum and Gin, and it is stated were offering to deliver same at any country station at the same price as that ruling in Stanley, i.e. free of freight.

Mr. Rowe states that he had an interview with Mr. G.R.L.Brown, acting as Treasurer, and asked him whether he was aware that the s.s. "LAFONIA" was selling Liquor in excess of her License. He is stated to have confirmed to Mr. Rowe that they had only a "Packet License" so that Mr. Rowe wrote him a letter couched in the following terms:

The Hon. Colonial Treasurer and Collector of Customs Stanley.

"Dear Sir,

In the month of November, 1931, Cpt.D.W. Roberts, Master of s.s. "LAFONIA" was granted a "Packet License" which would cover the sale of intoxicating Liquor "TO ANY PASSENGER ON BOARD SUCH VESSEL DURING HER ACTUAL PASSAGE BETWEEN THE SAID PLACES".

However, we understand that sales of liquor ex. s.s. "LAFONIA" have not been confined to passengers, but that liquor has been sold systematically at each port of call, to persons residing on shore. It does not appear to be a casual sale to oblige one or other, but a systematic trade. We would be under the impression that each such sale is illegal, and we lay complaint accordingly. We shall be glad to hear that the matter will be investigated and action taken.

With reference to your letter of the 12th of June, drawing attention to sales of Liquor ex s.s. "LAFONIA" to persons residing on shore at ports of call, I have the honour to inform you that the Falkland Islands Co.Ltd., have admitted that such sales have, in fact, taken place. I have investigated the matter fully and am satisfied that the fault has been committed through unintentional misconstruction of information given by this Department. I have the assurance of the Manager of the Falkland Islands Co., that he issued instructions to the Captain of the s.s. "LANONIA" on the 15th inst., for the immediate discontinuance of these sales. In the circumstances I do not think it necessary to pursue the matter further.

The Estate Louis Williams are dissatisfied with the reply as they maintain that a definite transgression of the law should have been dealt with by the Authorities in this particular case, as it would doubtless have been dealt with if any other firm or The Estate Louis Williams had similarly transgressed, The Ordinance (No.11 of 1882) states:

3. No person shall sell or expose for sale any intoxicating liquor without being duly licensed to sell the same, or at any place where he is no duly authorised to sell the same, any person who shall (except as the agent or servant of a licensed person, and then only in accordance with such person's license) sell any liquor without a licence authorising such sale shall forfeit and pay for a first offence any sum not less than Twentyfive pounds and not more than Fifty pounds, or shall be liable to imprisonment for any terms not less than one month, nor exceeding three months, and for a second and any subsequent offence shall be liable to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for any term not less than three months nor exceeding six months, and shall also for a first as well as any subsequent offence forfeit all liquor in his

possession, with the vessel containing the same". Therefore, on Licenses costing only £25 per annum, the Falkland Islands Co., appear to have been selling Wholesale and Retail at every port in the Islands, whereas they should have a Wholesale License for every port of call, which would cost them about £340.

The Estate Louis Williams consider it desirable that their advices of the matter should be placed before you, and they urge that the law should be exercised without prejudice or favour and that the Falkland Islands should have been prosecuted, their Licenses cancelled and fines imposed for each separate illegal sale of liquor, in accordance with the Ordina which they have, according to The Estate Louis Willi flagrantly transgressed.

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 118 of the 5th of September, 1932, forwarding for any observations I may wish to offer a copy of correspondence exchanged between the Colonial Office and Messrs. Edward Young and Co., Limited, on the subject of the sale of liquor on the s.s. "Lafonia". In the absence on leave of the Treasurer and Collector of Customs, Mr. M. C. Craigie-Malkett, who was concerned personally in the issue of the packet licence to the Master of the s.s. "Lafonia" I have not had an earlier opportunity for reply.

2. I have ascertained on enquiry that the practice complained of arose through a misunderstanding. It was discontinued in June last and has not been and will not be resumed. No grounds for criminal action in the matter have been disclosed.

3. The packet licence held by the Master of the "Lafonia" has been recently renewed. Due notice as to the prospective renewal was posted in accordance with law but no objection was taken thereto either by the Manager of the Estate Louis Williams or by any other party.

4. It is scarcely necessary for me to refute emphatically the allegation that the Falkland Islands Company/




