Winther Master - which took place near Cape Porpoise. Gast Falkland Island about Il viclock on the evening of the 26" net. The vessel which was bound from Malden Island for the English Channel for orders was laden with a cargo of quano and I am informed by the master ofher intended to call at this Port for provisions. Vortunately the master and ever were able to land by the ships boats rarly the next morning and after some little lime fell in with a small house at Yanny love occupied by David Hewilt, a shepherd in the imployment of the Valkland Islands Company Hewilt who is only a working man entertained the whole of the crew (15 hands all told) at his small house for several days, and perhaps the Board of Irade may think it desirable to make him some recompense for his humane conduct.
