In reply to your note of 24th, of February

Fre "St Emoch" of Glasgow, I can give you thef following particulars.

In December 1902 we found a Life-Buoy which I will forward you per first chance upon beach at Stephens Peak with ships name thereon.

On Dec 18th, 02 Louis Anderson picked up Bucket with Ships name thereon on Beach at South Harbour, Smylies Channell.

New Wood all in splintered masses & small pieces, some with Brass Hinges attached marked Glasgow but no other mark (about 9 in number) have been taken off the beach of late.

NO WELL DEFINED TRACE of any CERTAIN VESSEL beyond the Life-buoy & Bucket above referred to have been cast up to our knowledge.

Wood painted, Red Oxide or Brown Oxide from inside an Iron Ship has been in evidence during past months from time to time & also Deck Planking of Soft Wood, presumably Pine, & only one Tin of Provisions which was either Rabbit or Hare Soup found March 20th, last. No label or Marks thereon. Yours faithfully,
