with reference to my Despitch to. 30 of the 23nd February. I have the honour to submit herewith for your information a copy of a letter from the Magistrane. South Georgia, in regard to the steps taken to obtain an increased surply of whale oil is that Benendancy.

- 2. On receipt of the Espiatrate's letter I my informed you by telegram of the 20th Instant, of the very good whaling season at South Georgia, and of the loss by fire on the 11th March of Mesora Salvesen and Company's "moratic", with 10,000 barrels of oil.
- The information with regard to the satisfated number of 138,000 barrels of oil at South Georgia ready for salpment, mentioned in my telegram of the 20th Instant, was given to me by Mr. Henriksen. Mossrs Salvesen's Manager resident in South Georgia. Mr. Henriksen came to Stanley in a whale oatcher to report by telegram to his Firm the loss of the "Moratio" and to make arrangements to hasten shipment to Fn. land of their oil.
- 4. Captain J. Plobers, representing the Sundefjord Whaling Company wiso came to Stanley in the whale outcher, to apply for the use of the two
