Sir,

I am directed by Mr. Secretary Harcourt to acknowledge the receipt of your letter, B.M.(N.H.) 178/15, of the 31st March, forwarding the final report prepared by Mr. H.A.C. Hinton from the notes on whales and whaling left by the late Major Barrett-Hamilton.

Sir,

With reference to Mr. H. J. Read's letter of the 20th January last and previous correspondence on the same subject (C.C. 25781/1914) I am directed to state, for the information of Mr. Secretary Harcourt, that Mr. H. A. G. Hinton has now completed the second and final part of his Report on the late Major Barrett-Hamilton's Notes on Whaling in South Georgia. He has put an immense amount of work into the report, and Dr. Huxner, Keeper of the Department of Zoology, states that it appears to be a document of great interest and value. Among other things he has unearthed from an obscure fishery journal a most important account of the natural history of the humpback. He has translated this from the Norwegian original, and the Trustees have no hesitation in saying that it should be printed in extenso in his report.
