Instructions are being issued that all Steam Ships with whale oil cargos from South Shetlands or South Georgia bound to United Kingdom are to be ordered to call at Port Stanley or Monte Video for orders fullstop Vessels calling at these Ports in accordance with above are to be ordered to DAKAR fullstop.



Sir,

With reference to my Confidential despatch of the 7th of March, I have the honour to inform you that the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty now desire that all steam vessels bound to the United Kingdom from South Georgia or the South Shetlands should call either at Monte Video or at Port Stanley, and there obtain instructions as to their route.

2. The foregoing does not apply to sailing vessels, for which it is impossible to supply protection.

3. You should give the necessary orders to the Magistrate at South Georgia, but if a suitable opportunity occurs a copy of this despatch will be sent to him direct for his information and guidance.


