With reference to your letter No. 23031/3 of the 5th of May, 1957, and attached correspondence on the subject of the recovery of Whale Marking Darts, I am directed to inform you that payment was made in South Georgia to Paul Korslund who signed a voucher to that effect. As there appears to be some misunderstanding in the matter I would point out that it is the practice, owing to the refusal of the finders of darts to accept Falkland Islands notes, to pay the amount to the Company which in turn credits the finder with the equivalent of £1 in Norwegian kroners. It would appear that this was not done by the Company in this case. As the £1 in question has been paid to the Company in South Georgia Messrs Salvesen are not entitled to a refund.

WHALE-MARKING.

The Discovery Committee is making renewed experiments in whale-marking in the Antarctic.

The mark used, consists of a metal tube approximately 10 inches in length and $\frac{5}{8}$ of an inch in diameter, with a leaden head. It is designed to penetrate the blubber and enter the muscle for a few inches and should be found with little difficulty when the blubber is stripped. The tube has an inscription and a serial number at each end. A reward of £1 will be paid by the Discovery Committee, Colonial Office, London, England, for the return of each mark accompanied by the following particulars :--

At the Tenth Meeting of the International Whaling Commission held in The Hague earlier this year, the question of whale marking was considered and the Secretary to the Commission has since issued a memorandum, a copy of which I enclose.

There are two points which require attention: first, as regards Section 3 of the memorandum (Leaflets and Posters), I understand from the National Institute of Oceanography that they have a supply of a poster printed in English and Norwegian, copies of which could be used for the present in place of the coloured posters discussed at the Tenth Meeting, which will not be available in time for use during the coming season. Copies of the leaflet appended to the enclosed memorandum will also be made in a slightly amended form. I wonder whether it would be possible for these documents to be made available at the land stations on South Georgia. If so, we can arrange for copies to be sent to you.

The second point concerns rewards for the return of whale marks and is dealt with in Section 4 of the memorandum. It was the view of the International Whaling Commission that the normal amount of the reward should be increased from £1 to £5 (the exceptions relate only to such countries as Japan, where a £5 reward would be disproportionately high). In the past the rewards have been paid by the National Institute of Oceanography, but at the Tenth Meeting, representatives of the whaling companies, several of whom were present, expressed the view that their companies would be prepared to pay the rewards from their own funds. It is, of course, a fact that much knowledge which is of great assistance to the whaling industry is obtained through marking whales, and the whaling companies rightly acknowledge its value.

We have written to Salvesen's and Hector's, the two United Kingdom companies, asking for confirmation that they will, in fact, be prepared to bear the cost of the increased rewards, and in so doing we have mentioned to Salvesen's the question of their land station on South Georgia, where we assume they will also wish to pay the rewards if they do so on their pelagic whaling fleets. I enclose a copy of our letter to Salvesen's for your information. In addition, however, action will be necessary in respect of the Argentinian and Norwegian land stations on South Georgia, and the proper line of approach to them would seem to be through the Administrative Officer. If you agree, we should be grateful if you could make the necessary arrangements.

Dear Captain Salvesen,

As you are no doubt aware, a discussion took place at the Tenth Meeting of the International Whaling Commission in The Hague on the question of whale marking.

One point raised was the amount of the reward which should be given to the finders of whale marks, and the view was expressed that many whaling companies might themselves be prepared to pay a £5 reward for every mark returned. It was consequently proposed that the amount of the reward should normally be increased to this amount and the point is covered in Section 4 of the enclosed memorandum on whale marking which has now been circulated by the Commission's Secretary.

So far as the United Kingdom is concerned, we shall of course be very pleased if you are able to fall in with the new arrangement, one advantage of which is that the prospect of an immediate cash reward at the higher rate should prove an added inducement to crews to keep a sharp look-out for whale marks and surrender them when they are found. Perhaps you will kindly let me know whether your company in fact plans to assist with this important work by meeting the cost of the higher rewards in the coming season. It is of course intended that the higher rewards should be paid in respect of marks found both in the course of pelagic whaling and on land stations, and no doubt you will wish the same arrangements to be made at your land station on South Georgia as on the factory ships "Southern Venturer" and "Southern Harvester".

Other questions which were raised at the same meeting of the International Whaling Commission, and which are mentioned in Section 3 of the enclosed memorandum, relate to the distribution of leaflets and posters. As you will see, no arrangements have been made to print posters for the coming season but the National Institute of Oceanography has, I understand, a supply printed in English and Norwegian which have been used in the past. Subject to your views, we propose that whaling inspectors should bring with them small supplies of these and of leaflets on the lines of that suggested at the end of the memorandum, when joining factory ships. We should be glad if they could then be suitably exhibited.

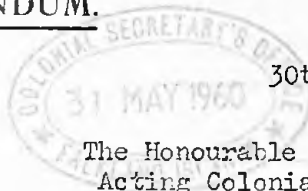

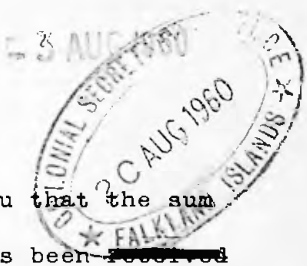
