CONDITIONS

(SECTION 9 OF THE WHALE FISHERY ORDINANCE, AS AMENDED)

The remuneration of the gunners and crew of the ship shall depend to a considerable extent upon such factors as the species, size and yield of whales taken.

No bonus or other remuneration shall be paid to the gunners or crew in respect of the taking of milk-filled, lactating or undersized whales.

There must be recorded in the prescribed manner and by the prescribed person :—

- (i) With respect to each whale treated in the ship or factory, the date and place of taking, the species and the sex of the whale, and such measurements and other biological information (including information as to the contents of its internal organs) as may be prescribed; and
- (ii) the prescribed particulars as to the number of whales treated in the ship or factory, and as to the yield of oil of different grades, and the quantities of meal, guano and other products derived from those whales;

The ship or factory must be equipped with plant of a type approved by the Governor or by such officer as the Governor may appoint for the purpose, for the extraction of oil from the blubber, flesh and bones of whales and steps must be taken to ensure that the plant is kept in good order and operated efficiently;

Except in the case of a whale, or part of a whale intended to be used for human food, the oil must be extracted, by boiling or otherwise, from all whale blubber, from the heads and tongues of whales and from their tails as far forward as the outer opening of the lower intestine;

In the case of a factory adequate arrangements must be made for utilising residual products;

No whale of a class the killing or taking of which is prohibited by the International Whaling Commission shall be treated in the ship;

The records required by the Licence to be kept must be transmitted, at such times and in such manner as may be prescribed, to the Colonial Secretary or such other officer as the Governor may appoint for the purpose.

This licence is issued on condition that the licensee shall provide board and lodging equal to officer status for one whaling inspector, who will reside at the station of the licensee throughout the season. The Government undertakes to reimburse the licensee for the cost of such board and lodging.

Notwithstanding anything in this licence the total catch for the season shall not exceed a total of 195 Blue Whale Units. The term catch being interpreted to mean the total of all baleen whales killed.

The ship or factory must be equipped with plant of a type approved by the Governor or by such officer as the Governor may appoint for the purpose, for the extraction of oil from the blubber, flesh and bones of whales and steps must be taken to ensure that the plant is kept in good order and operated efficiently;

Except in the case of a whale, or part of a whale intended to be used for human food, the oil must be extracted, by boiling or otherwise, from all whale blubber, from the heads and tongues of whales and from their tails as far forward as the outer opening of the lower intestine;

In the case of a factory adequate arrangements must be made for utilising residual products;

No whale of a class the killing or taking of which is prohibited by the International Whaling Commission shall be treated in the ship;

The records required by the Licence to be kept must be transmitted, at such times and in such manner as may be prescribed, to the Colonial Secretary or such other officer as the Governor may appoint for the purpose.

This licence is issued on condition that the licensee shall provide board and lodging equal to officer status for one whaling inspector, who will reside at the station of the licensee throughout the season. The Government undertakes to reimburse the licensee for the cost of such board and lodging.

Notwithstanding anything in this licence the total catch for the season shall not exceed a total of 195 Blue Whale Units. The term catch being interpreted to mean the total of all baleen whales killed.
