A large amount of bone meal and also guano is produced at South Georgia. When the 'Darwin' goes to South Georgia in June we have a certain amount of cargo space reserved for us by the terms of our charter but apparently we never use it. I do not know whether the question of importing fertilisers from South Georgia has ever been considered, if not, it is I think worth finding out from the A/O at what price we could buy it and consider shipping it in the 'Darwin' or possibly there might even be space in some of the B.A.S. ships. Bone meal is apparently quite an unobjectionable cargo though guano is very smelly. It would probably be worth the Agricultural Department importing it for themselves but apart from this the dairymen would no doubt be willing to buy it if they could get it at a reasonable price.

We acknowledge your letter No. D/1/62 of 18th inst. which refers to your previous letter under the same heading dated 7th inst.

We have not yet replied to this, being under the impression that you were to supply details of the final destination of the proposed importation of fertilizer from South Georgia.

The conditions governing the Winter voyage of R.M.S. "Darwin" to South Georgia allow Government up to 50 tons of cargo to be carried freight free, in other words, loaded, transported and landed on the jetty at Grytviken, or in the reverse direction at Stanley, for no charge.

Under Section 7 of the Mail Contract the Company is at liberty to charge Wharfage on cargo emanating from South Georgia, therefore if the fertilizer is destined for Stanley it will bear a charge of 11/8d per ton W/M. which includes 7 days free storage, and 15/- per ton W/M. for storing and re-shipping that part of the consignment which is re-consigned to ports outside Stanley.
