GOVERNMENT QUARTERS, SOUTH GEORGIA.

Mr A. G. Simon, Customs Officer, South Georgia, now in Stanley, informs me that the roof of the Government Quarters at South Georgia is in a wretched condition and leaks badly every time there is rain, and that it requires re-roofing. He tells me that he understood that Mr Binnie, the Magistrate, was writing on the subject, and to inform me that he can obtain the necessary timber and galvanized iron sheeting which he recommends should be obtained and the building re-roofed.


I have received no letter from Mr Binnie on the subject. I have referred to Mr Binnie for his observations a Minute by Mr Condell suggesting that the Quarters should be removed to the other side of the Bay and built on land leased to the Compania Argentina de Pesca, the Company having no objections. As I am at present advised I see many objections to the Government Buildings being on land leased, and I consider it more preferable that the Quarters should remain on the present Government site. If Mr Binnie, after further consideration, concurs in these views I authorize him to immediately procure the necessary timber and galvanized sheeting to re-roof and repair the Quarters.

From the report made by Mr Condell it appears to me that the accommodation in the quarters is somewhat cramped, and in the event of the building being re-roofed I think the opportunity should be taken to enlarge the Quarters by the addition of two rooms on the ground floor ~~and two rooms above~~, somewhat after the annexed plans which I have prepared on the information given to me by Mr Simon concerning the arrangement of the present quarters.

If

If Mr Binnie concurs in this and can obtain the necessary lumber and materials and have the work executed at once before the winter season sets in I authorize him to do so. He will exercise due regard to economy.

It will be noticed that the two rooms I propose to add on are an Office and a Sitting Room, each measuring 15' X 18' - 36' being the assumed width of the building - The Office to have a porch entrance and certain re-arrangements turning the present Office into a Bedroom.

Please have the several rooms in the quarters fitted with the cork carpet as soon as received.



With reference to His Excellency the Governor's Minute to me in C.S. 109/19 on the subject of the Government Quarters at South Georgia, and my letter No. 16/19 of the 30th January which was inadvertently omitted from the mail sent direct to Stanley by the s.s. "Pelican", I have the honour to inform you that I have procured sufficient iron and timber to reccf the Quarters and the work will commence on Monday the 17th March. I think that perhaps after all if the house is furnished by Government and lighted from the electric plant at the Station the question of moving it could be dropped and the difficulties of mail receiving and delivering in winter and receiving vessels could be overlooked even the attraction of more sunshine.

2. It was not my intention to rebuild the Quarters on land leased to Cia A. de Pesca, the position was quite outside their boundary according to the second schedule of their lease, Mr Condell appears to have been under a misapprehension regarding this point.
