To The Admin. Officer, South Georgia.

CONFIDENTIAL. No 62. Grateful your views and recommendations on the question of lack of religious instruction South Georgia together with reference to any earlier correspondence or discussions on subject.

- 2. My impression is that there is need and desire among appreciable section of community though probably managements indifferent particularly during season.
- 3. Most suitable candidate would appear to be bilingual Anglican or Lutheran with Seamens' Mission experience who might come out experimentally during winter. First essential would be managements co-operation and preferable if they took the initiative but will await your reply before discussing detailed plans.
