Statements made by Browell are fantastic and ridiculous and reference to heavy work clearing snow etc. not understood. There are two furnaces to which fuel might have to be conveyed through snow every ten days in winter, distance in each case measuring ten yards exactly but when this is necessary it can and is done by sledge. It would be a very poor workman who could not keep buildings properly maintained and painted by rotational work each year. Duties performed by Browell were as stated in my letter 25th.
